Comments:

I support this resolution, but would ask that it be amended to include the island of Lāna'i. Residents of Lāna'i too, face the daily challenges of having only one commercial air carrier. There are several other air carriers operating in and out from/to Lāna'i, but none other than Mokulele carry non-hotel-guests. Mokulele has, despite its good intentions, consistenly cancelled many flights, frequently arrives and/or departs late, and provides exceptionally little communication with the impacted passengers. And yes, we have a ferry to Lahaina, but this does not preclude the need for consistent air travel to and from O'ahu.
