School Facilities Authority Testimony: Senate Ways and Means Committee 01/13/23

Overview:

- The School Facilities Authority ("SFA") has statutory authority over new schools and new school facility construction, public-private partnerships ("P3"), and school redevelopment work. As a newly established Authority with an independent governing board ("Board"), the SFA, in conjunction with their Board, is creating the strategic vision, plan, and objectives.
- 2. As a new State authority, the SFA is currently focused on standing itself up as an independent authority. Additionally, the SFA is working with our State partners to fulfill the statutory obligations as noted in Act 248 and Act 257, 2022.

Federal Funds:

1. The SFA does not receive any Federal funds.

Non-General Funds:

1. The SFA does not have any non-general funds at this time.

Budget Requests:

- The SFA internally discussed the most pressing capacity needs for the Authority based on the statutory responsibilities given to it through Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") 302A-1700. The budget recommendations were then put before the Board for discussion and approval. The budget was approved by the Board and submitted to Budget and Finance.
- 2. The SFA is not requesting additional general funds in this Executive Budget request. The SFA is requesting an internal shift of funding to cover the costs of the requested 3 FTEs.

Who we are

- The School Facilities Authority (SFA) was established in 2020 by Act 72 (2020) and further defined by Act 217 (2021).
- The SFA's statutory responsibilities are for public school development, planning, and construction related to capital improvement projects assigned by the legislature, governor, or board of education. (HRS302A-1703)
 - Projects include major renovations, new school facilities, and public-private partnerships (HRS302A-1701)
- The SFA has its own independent board of directors made up of five voting members who head and oversee the authority.
 - Current Chair of the board is Alan Oshima

SFA Staffing

- SFA currently has four appropriated FTE positions in FY23
 - Executive Director Chad "Keone" Farias
 - Administrative Services Officer Scott Fuji
 - Business Manager Cindy Watarida
- SFA is in active recruitment for the fourth position
 - Seeking a project manager to assist with ongoing and future projects

SFA Executive Budget Requests

- Authority Capacity Building
 - 3 permanent Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) for capacity building within the SFA to perform the statutorily directed work
 - If approved, positions will include a project manager, planner, and management analyst
 - No additional funding requested for these positions
- Capital Improvement Projects (CIP)
 - FY24: \$750,000 for statewide capacity projects
 - FY25: \$5,250,000 for statewide capacity projects
