Comments:

As a registered lobbyist, I strongly support SB1453 which expands the definition of "administrative action" in lobbyists law to include granting or denying applications for business or development-related permits, licenses, or approvals and procurement of goods and services under the Hawaii Public Procurement Code. This bill will help ensure transparency and accountability in the lobbying process by making it clear that the lobbyists law applies to all branches of government, including the executive branch.

The current definition of "administrative action" in lobbyists law is outdated and does not take into account the many different ways in which lobbyists can influence government decisions. By expanding the definition to include procurement of goods and services and decision making on permits, licenses, and approvals, this bill will help ensure that all forms of lobbying are subject to the same standards of transparency and accountability. This will help to prevent conflicts of interest and ensure that the public's interests are protected. With the passage of this bill, we can be confident that the lobbying process in Hawaii is fair and transparent.
