Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran and members of the Committee:

I am Beverly Gotelli, a 5 year member and Vice Chair of the Policy Advisory Board for Elder Affairs (PABEA), which is an appointed board tasked with advising the Executive Office on Aging (EOA). My testimony does not represent the views of the EOA but of PABEA. PABEA supports this measure to appropriate funds for additional positions to meet the demands for assistance caused by increased reports on fraud, healthcare billing errors and abuse. It is not only our vulnerable seniors that are affected by fraud but also their families and caregivers.

Residents with incorrect or false claims could be better served if SMP Hawaii had adequate staffing. More cases of suspected fraud or abuse could be resolved, with Medicare/Medicaid cost savings, recoveries or avoidance resulting. With only two full-time staff members for the past 25 years, we are grateful that SMP Hawaii has managed to-date, but it is really at a tipping point since the Baby Boomers, the largest population of our country, entered their "golden years" in 2011 here in Hawaii. This population will only increase through the next two decades. Scams on the phone and via email and social media have also risen. Now is the time to act to genuinely help our Kupuna, those most vulnerable to fraudsters.

- EOA's Position: The Executive Office on Aging (EOA), an attached agency to the Department
- of Health, strongly supports the intent of SB 1592, SD1, relating to Senior Medicare Patrol
- 3 (SMP) Hawaii.
- 4 **Fiscal Implications:** This measure appropriates funds for SFY 2023 and the same sum for SFY
- 5 2024 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) Program Specialist III position, one full-time
- 6 equivalent (1.0 FTE) Program Specialist IV position, and one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 7 Program Specialist V position and shall be expended by the EOA.
- 8 **Purpose and Justification:** The purpose is to appropriate funds for three (3) full-time
- 9 permanent positions to further assist the EOA's SMP Hawaii program as well as expand the
- 10 EOA's ability to protect the states kūpuna against the onslaught of multiple forms of frauds and
- scams being besieged upon them. These positions will strengthen and increase EOA's ability to

ensure that timely, reliable, and accurate services are provided to kūpuna, their families, and caregivers in need.

SMP Hawaii's mission is to provide a "help net" to educate, assist, and refer residents to the proper authorities, and be a reliable source for accurate information and responsive assistance with Medicare, Medicaid, and other health-related scams, fraud, or abuse.

Unfortunately, scams and fraudulent behaviors against our kūpuna are not limited to Medicare, Medicaid, and other health-related scams. As a community, we have all experienced the increase of other types of scam behaviors on our phones, social media accounts, emails and even the television ads that harangue us with enticing offers that are "too good to be true!" Our shorelines no longer protect us from the barrage of scams that inundate us due to our growing reliance on the internet and social media in our daily lives.

Hawaii ranks number one nationwide in longevity at 81.3 years of age! As the population of those age 65 and over is projected to grow, so has the incidence of scams that target this vulnerable group. The frequency and complexity of scams have grown significantly as con artists know that Hawaii's people are very giving and trusting of others by nature and the potential for harm to this targeted group continues to rise disproportionally.

SMP Hawaii receives various statewide inquires on our dedicated Helpline and our interactive website from kupuna calling for assistance and are too ashamed and embarrassed to reach out to their own loved ones. SMP provides a clearing house for our kūpuna, their families, and caregivers to call for help.

SMP Hawaii operates statewide providing a toll-free helpline, provides 1:1 counseling and referrals and conducts community outreach to underserved groups and communities to expand access and assistance for Medicare, Medicaid, and other health-related scams, fraud, or abuse as well as many other types of scams and fraud against our islands kūpuna.

In response to the rise in scams, SMP Hawaii has established a network of partnerships across the finance, technology, legal, and retail industries to triage non-health related fraud cases

- to the proper authority to provide timely assistance with gift card and charity schemes, romance,
- 2 caregiver, and imposter scams and ransomware that trick older adults into giving away their
- 3 personal information and money.
- 4 Unfortunately, the prognosis for our kūpuna safety does not look promising. Annually,
- 5 Medicare loses an estimated \$70 billion dollars to fraudulent claims. Criminals steal an average
- 6 \$34,200 per victim. Hawaii reports over \$17 million lost annually to online scams. If our
- 7 community is unable to increase awareness, educate our kūpuna regarding scams and fraud, and
- build stronger community resources, Hawaii is projected to lose more than \$53 million annually
- 9 by 2035!
- SMP Hawaii was established in 1997, and for twenty-five years, EOA has operated this
- program with two temporary full-time staff who recruit, train, and retain a cohort of volunteers
- statewide. The passing of this bill to establish three (3) critically needed permanent full-time
- positions will allow for the needed expansion of EOA's capacity to meet the demands for timely,
- accurate, and reliable services to kūpuna, family members, and caregivers in need.
- EOA's mission is "To optimize the health, safety and independence of Hawaii's older
- adults and people with disabilities. We support kūpuna and their caregivers through planning,
- development, advocacy, and coordination of policies, programs, and services." Without an
- increase in staffing, EOA is limited in our ability to safeguard against further kūpuna
- victimization and preserve the Medicare program, thus jeopardizing EOA's directed mission.
- These positions are direly needed to continue to build a stronger, wider, and safer "help
- 21 net" for a most valued asset, our islands' kūpuna.
- 22 **Recommendation**: EOA strongly supports the intent of this measure provided that its enactment
- 23 does not reduce or replace priorities with the Administration's budget request.

We have a membership of nearly 38 million nationwide and nearly 140,000 in Hawaii. We advocate at the state and federal level for the issues that matter most to older adults and their families.

**AARP supports S.B. 1592, SD1** which appropriates funds for additional positions within the State's Senior Medicare Patrol Program (SMP) to meet the rising demand for assistance caused by increased reports of health fraud, medical billing errors, and abuse.

SMP plays a vital role in advocating, educating, and protecting Hawaii's most vulnerable population. There are rising numbers of health-related scams and frauds targeting people especially older adults with Medicare coverage. Identity theft, gift cards, COVID test kits/vaccines/cures, durable medical equipment, genetic testing are common tactics that scammers use to defraud unknowing victims.
