Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and Committee Members:

The League of Women Voters acknowledges that administrative lobbying is an important issue and the League supports efforts to prevent third parties from exercising undue and often secretive efforts to influence decisions of the executive branch of the State. However, care must be taken to allow normal administrative transactions (such as getting a permit, reporting a spill to DOH, etc.) These normal activities must be separated from attempts to exercise undue political influence or to apply other pressure on executive branch employees. The League looks forward to continued action on this matter in the future.
