In addition, revenue generated from the use of public resources (streets and sidewalks) is not subject to the standard measures and restrictions which normally insure transparency and accountability for the use of public resources.

I suggest, in order to promote equal treatment and access among applicants for liquor licenses, that under the section relating to nonprofits that the language be changed from

"A nonprofit organization granted a temporary license shall restrict the sale and consumption of liquor to confined and demarcated areas that shall not be located on any pgblic road, street, sidewalk, or pedestrian walkway..."

to "Any organization or business granted ... "
