The Hawaii Crop Improvement Association (HCIA) appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony **in support of SCR109/SR115**, which urges the Department of Agriculture to designate Kunia, Leilehua Plateau, and Poamoho as the Central Oahu Agricultural Corridor and to establish a list prioritizing potential agricultural infrastructure improvement projects that would provide the most value to the state.
