## II. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Operating as a 501 c-3 non-profit organization on Kaua'i since 2008, Equine Therapy, Inc. (dba Healing Horses, Kaua'i) has served more than 700 participants and volunteers with horsemanship programs annually. Healing Horses, Kaua'i's (HHK) mission is to enrich the lives of people of all abilities through Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies, improving their physical, cognitive, social and/or emotional well-being. The majority of HHK's lessons serve youths and adults with disabilities. HHK's main arena has an uninterrupted view of Nounou Mountain, secluded pond trail and forested foreground just a block from the ocean while being easily accessed via the Kapa'a Bypass. HHK is the only organization on Kaua'i that provides assisted mounting for equine activities. HHK's facility is equipped with a wheelchair accessible mounting ramp, Handi-Van accessible parking lot and an ADA toilet. With eight horses and two Miniature Horses, HHK offers traditional and therapeutic riding and carriage driving lessons to Kaua'i residents and visitors of all ages and abilities while focusing on increasing independence by developing strength, balance, confidence and communication skills. Our horses' walking mechanics stimulate the riders' neurological system which improves muscle strength, range of motion, metabolism, posture and ambulation. The bonds between rider and horse and between the riders themselves foster a sense of community and belonging, as well as developing empathy and compassion for all living things. Through involvement with HHK activities, participants improve their communication, coping and resiliency skills.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Our horses are the backbone of our program and their care is foremost in our hearts and minds. HHK has come up against some fearsome realities as our operating expenses have skyrocketed due to inflation and minimum wage increases. Looking for any and all ways to lower our overhead, we are enhancing our Volunteer recruitment efforts, taking on payroll tasks that we've previously contracted out and now applying for monies to help us become more self-reliant in feeding our horses, lowering our enormous feed bill. Presently we feed nine horses to the tune of \$1,200/month. We believe we can cut that bill in half by growing and maintaining our own grazing paddocks. But our 40 year old tractor has died and we desperately need a new (used is fine) tractor to manifest our next dream and feed our horses well for half the cost.

Therefore, our objective is to raise enough money to purchase a newer tractor along with the necessary attachments to build and maintain our facility ultimately providing rotating grazing paddocks to support our horses' health at reduced overhead.

Our goal is to tighten our belts and keep our programs open for Kaua'i's kids and adults with Special Needs, as we have done for the past 23 years.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The majority of HHK's lessons serve persons with disabilities (56%) and children ages 4-12 (70%). Another 21% of lessons serve clients who are low income (federal poverty level, but nearly 70% are ALICE levels) with one or more mental/cognitive, developmental, social/emotional or physical diagnoses. Yet to truly fulfill our mission, "to enrich the lives of people of all abilities", HHK has successfully developed our Carriage Driving Program that provides equine activities for clients who are unable to ride a horse, but can enjoy driving a horse and carriage.

Kaua'i county has a population of 72,000+ people. Of those residents there is an average of seven new spinal injuries, 138 strokes and 223 traumatic brain injuries per year. Due to Kauai'i's rural location, there are limited ADA accessible exercise opportunities, advanced therapeutic treatments and social services for residents with physical disabilities. According to the Hawai'i Tourism Authority's website, only three beaches provide all-terrain wheelchairs. AllTrail.com indicates that Kaua'i only has eight wheelchair friendly hiking trails. HHK is the only ADA accessible riding facility, and at affordable rates allowing participants to benefit from weekly lessons, as opposed to a one-time special event.

Throughout their lessons participants learn communication skills, both verbal and non-verbal, as they communicate with their horse as well as their peers. As participants work towards riding or driving independently, they gain self-confidence and self-esteem. Often, due to their disabilities, their social circles are small, if non-existent. Bonds and lasting friendships are formed between the participants, their horses and their support team (instructors, side-walkers, leaders) as they expand their socialization skills.

Providing healthy, covid safe outdoor exercise activities for all populations incorporates intergenerational and special needs programming that instills self-confidence and strengthens the individual, and ultimately our community. Horses quickly mirror our emotions, making them terrific partners to improve our social emotional development and psychological recovery regardless of the etiology. Via the horses' instantaneous and honest feedback, participants become cognizant of non-verbal communication and learn to recognize their own fear/anger responses. Experiencing our horses' needs and reactions to our behaviors leads to living with compassion, empathy and kindness. Participants improve their communication, coping and resiliency skills while gaining a sense of community and compassion by helping and supporting others and decreasing isolation and increasing connection. We all rise up together. We serve children and adults of all ages, with or without special needs on Kaua'i. We offer therapeutic horsemanship lessons teaching grooming, leading, side walking, riding and carriage driving safely. Additionally, our two Miniature Horses hop in our Mini Van (all puns intended) and visit five nursing homes across the island (KVMH, Hale Kupuna, Kaua'i Care Center, The Regency at Pua Kea and Samuel Mahelona Hospital) every Wednesday morning. We also offer seven weeks of day camps throughout the year when our schools are in recess. Our nine horses require a great deal of food to stay happy, healthy and working with cooperative attitudes. It takes special horses to work with so many different riders with varying abilities and special needs. Presently, our feed bill has risen exponentially between inflation and our inability to graze nine horses successfully on our 5 acres of cleared leased land. We have devoted our last year, and every penny we could muster, to clearing an additional 10 acres, building a second arena for our carriage driving program and planning three paddocks to offer rotational grazing for our beloved horses. Most importantly, we believe it would cut our feed bill in half if we didn't have to purchase hay at \$55/bale and help us stay in business. However, and this is where your Grant in Aid comes in, our present tractor is a 1982 Kubota that has broken down and will cost upwards of \$10.000+ to repair. The mechanic is uncertain that the repair would be successful depending on what else brakes off in the process and feels such an investment in a 40 year old machine is unwise. Nonetheless, we desperately need a new tractor with enough power to shred the paddocks, till the overgrazed paddocks, recondition the soil with our own homegrown manure supply and reseed with pasture grass. Ranches require heavy equipment to maintain the facility, moving manure, building strong fence lines and turning manure piles into compostable material. Therefore, we are asking for funding to purchase a new tractor with the necessary attachments, as well as providing funding for a portion of our facility manager's pay to run and maintain the tractor.

Our mission is to serve Kaua'i's children and adults with diagnosed special needs. However, over the past 23 years we have discovered that most people have some situation that draws them to the power and healing that horses provide. The love affair starts on the ground, not in the saddle, opening our hearts and minds to the sentient being we call 'horse'. So, we welcome all to our ranch to receive these healing experiences.

We are asking roughly \$100,000 to purchase a Kubota 6060 tractor with a 4 in 1 bucket, backhoe, shredder/mower, box scraper, aerator/tiller, auger and 12 inch chipper (Bacon Universal's estimate attached), as well as \$18,578 partial operational cost of our Facility Manager's annual salary (estimated use of his tractor time maintaining our facility).

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

Healing Horses, Kaua'i follows the recommendations set forth by PATH, Intl. (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship, International), regarding equine therapy participation contraindications and precautions. We do serve people of all abilities and disabilities, but always within the PATH, Intl.'s guidelines for safety. When mounted riding is contraindicated, we offer carriage driving. When carriage driving is contraindicated, we offer groundwork, grooming and feeding opportunities. HHK does not differentiate or discriminate, for or against any demographic descriptor. Every participant we serve is unique, but HHK makes certain to serve the disadvantaged that the Grant in Aid pledges to serve and support.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

HHK, as the only consistent program on Kaua'i serving children and adults with Special Needs, happily enjoys participants from all sides of our island.

## III. Service Summary and Outcomes

HHK has hired a Facility's Manager who is responsible for maintaining our fifteen leased acres from Bette Midler. The work proposed is to continue clearing a firebreak on the land fronting Kuhio Hwy. and shred the tall guinea grass on the front ten acres, keeping it trimmed for rotating and grazing our horses, as well as reducing fire threats on our ranch. Additionally, with a fully functioning tractor, we could string new sturdy fence lines throughout our property to safely contain our horses from breaking through a fence line and becoming loose on the roads surrounding us. Lastly, with the appropriate attachments, we will re-till the barren overgrazed five acres, spread composted manure throughout and seed those acres with pasture grass culminating in two more grazing paddocks

# for our horses. Ultimately, we envision a greater ability for self-reliance and great savings for us in our presently exorbitant feed costs.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Once we receive funding for our tractor, I imagine ordering and delivery might take a few months, allowing us to start our projects by early next year (1/2025). The grazing paddocks will be fenced first within one month's time, then maintained monthly with the shredder. The firebreak will take two to three weeks to clear at which time it also will be maintained on a monthly schedule. The five back acres will be a more difficult project, but will happen next and should begin to grow grass within one to two years from breaking ground with the tiller. Of course, maintenance of fence lines, composting manure, grazing pastures and arena footing goes on forever, but the initial projects should be completed within two years' time, ie: January 2027.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

Quality assurance and evaluation are critical aspects of the Equine Therapy, Inc. programs. Our systems of checks and balances includes a combination of standardized data collection to achieve both quantitative and qualitative measures of success. HHK's board meets monthly to ensure that all achievement goals are being accomplished in the timeframes established. The board has a year long calendar filled with monthly goals and reviewed at each meeting. The ordering and purchasing of major equipment items are singular events that have clear achievement deadlines. The ongoing/procedural portions of the project (such as clearing, fencing and planting) have target deadlines and a crew of staff and volunteers assigned to complete them. Our Board of Directors, Staff and Volunteers will all view and communicate each step of our projects' processes. We will document each step of the way with photos and receipts for monies spent.

We will document via photos each step in our process to improve and strengthen our fence lines, provide three grazing paddocks on our front ten acres for our nine horses, recondition and replant pasture grasses on the back five acres for future grazing areas. Most importantly, we will be able to document our decreasing feed bill and increasing self-sufficiency by growing our own pasture grasses. The progress achieved will also be reported at our monthly volunteer and board meetings where staff and volunteers can reflect and suggest strategies for improvement as we move forward.

## V. Experience and Capability

## 1. Necessary Skills and Experience

Healing Horses Kauai (HHK) started in 2001 as an extension of private practice social work. In the early years, HHK's founder and her volunteers trailered the horses various pastures to meet with clients. They became PATH Intl. registered riding instructors. In 2012 HHK moved to its Kapa'a Bypass Rd. location with the goal to develop a new ADA accessible community riding facility on 15 leased acres of land. With its Handi-Van accessible parking lot, ADA toilet and wheelchair accessible mounting ramps this location opened the door to even more riders, and eliminated trailer stresses. The current HHK staff consists of 60+ employees/volunteers. Employees have experience involved with social work and counseling, horse training, horse therapy, and ranch management. Employees and volunteers work in health care, animal science, equestrian breeding and genetics, social work, archeology, web design, retail, education, ranching/farming and are also involved with other Kauai organizations (Burial Council, Master Gardeners, Scouts, KORE , the Surfrider Foundation, etc.). With such a diverse population of folks, we have a large pool of knowledge available to draw from, to plan, coordinate, and carry out a variety of projects.

Our board president oversaw the capital campaign in 2012-13 securing the land we are located on now, clearing and fencing 6 acres, and installing arena, stalls, and sheds. The current E.D. assisted a former E.D. during her capital campaign in 2017 to trench, install plumbing, parking lot repairs, hitching posts, and medicine wheel (private intake area) and another round pen. The current E.D. (with the board) has also managed several program and capital improvement grants over the last few years to secure scholarship and stipends, horses, fencing, equipment/supplies, and tack. We have several volunteers/associate members that are equine professionals, general contractors, and owner/operators of local companies willing to collaborate/advise as we proceed. Our current E.D., and several board members have carriage driving experience. Our board members also bring with them experience in the fields of medicine, social work, consulting, marketing, business/entrepreneurship, art and graphic design.

## 2. Facilities

On the island of Kauai, on approximately 19 acres across from the Coconut Marketplace, HHK's arena location has an uninterrupted view of Nounou Mountain, secluded/shady trails along a 1.5 acre pond and forested foreground just a block front the ocean. Conveniently located at the Wailua end of the Kapaa Bypass Rd, HHK is the only organization on the island of Kauai that provides assisted mounting for equine activities. HHK's facility is equipped with wheelchair accessible mounting ramps, Handi-Van accessible parking lot, and an ADA toilet. With 7 horses and 2 miniature horses, HHK offers traditional and therapeutic riding lessons to Kauai residents and visitors (of all ages and ability); focusing on increasing independence by developing strength, balance, confidence and communication. In 2021, HHK began the process to increase its program services to include cart/carriage driving partnering with our miniature horses, trained goats and acquired carriage trained draft horses so as to incorporate larger adults and wheelchair accessible driving. As part of this expansion, HHK undertook the clearing of 9+ acreage along the Kuhio Hwy (across from the Coconut Marketplace) of invasive plant species and years of rubbish to create more pasture land, riding and driving trails (while also beautifying the Kuhio Hwy/Bypass corridor through native tree/hedge plant species restoration). The additional pasture (and its rotational grazing and trail/tract systems) will increase the health of our equines and land stewardship and essentially quadruple the length of our trail system. This means that participants can drive/ride along a variety of routes without ever having to leave the property.

# VI. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

## 1. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

The HHK staff consists of 60+ employees/volunteers. Employees have experience involved with social work and counseling, horse training, horse therapy, and ranch management. Employees and volunteers work in health care, animal science, equestrian breeding and genetics, social work, archeology, web design, retail, education, ranching/farming and are also involved with other Kauai organizations (Burial Council, Master Gardeners, Scouts, KORE surf, the Surfrider Foundation, etc.). With such a diverse population of folks, we have a large pool of knowledge available to draw from to plan, coordinate, and carry out a variety of projects.

All staff members and volunteers complete supervised hands-on training with the program director and/or executive director (online resources are also available for at home study). Typically volunteers begin as stall cleaners and feeders, then move to arena side walkers, move on to horse handling, before beginning instructor training. In this way they get to know the personality of our equines, our clients, and protocols/systems. Instructor training focuses on ensuring safety, pedagogy, appropriate goal setting, task analysis and horsemanship. Ongoing quarterly training is required by staff to include updates and reviews of skill.

Executive Director Roles: grant writing, project coordination, program & development director, developing instructor training program, public relation, supervises facilities manager and Instructors

Samantha Henriques - Executive Director, Healing Horses Kauai- (PATH Intl. Instructor, National Athletic Trainers Association Certified Aathletic Trainer, Kauai Master Gardener). Samantha Henriques received BA degrees in Sports Medicine, Environmental Biology, English & Physical Education; a MS degree in HPER-Sports Psychology, and post-baccalaureate teaching certification in Secondary Science from UH-Manoa. Mrs. Henriques is a NATA Certified Athletic Trainer, NSCA Strength and Conditioning Specialist, NASM Corrective Exercise Specialist, AHA Instructor, and Kauai Master Gardener. She has been an athletic trainer and teacher at both the secondary and collegiate levels; she has also been an EMT, camp counselor, field researcher and international MLS physiotherapist. Samantha Henriques worked at a 45 horse pleasure barn in Wisconsin for 2 years before beginning her volunteer service Healing Horses in 2008. In 2017 she assisted the former E.D. during her capital campaign to trench, install plumbing, parking lot repairs, hitching posts, and medicine wheel (private intake area) and another round pen. She became the executive director in 2019. Since then she has also managed several program and capital improvement grants to secure scholarships and stipends, horses, fencing, equipment/supplies, and tack.

Program Director Roles: arena volunteer coordinator, horse feeder coordinator, lesson scheduler, barn manager, head instructor (intake meetings, create scope and sequence lessons to achieve participant goals).

Gingerly Chapin - Program Director (PATH Intl. Instructor)

Gingerly Chapin was born and raised on Kauai, Ginger has been riding horses since she could walk. 
