lwikua has been operational since 2015 under the direction of Executive Director - Joshua Mori. Our programming pillars work together cohesively to create a full-circle community intervention. Spiritual and cultural health, physical fitness, access to healthy food, and connection to land are integral components of a thriving, well-rounded, and contributing West Kaua'i community member.

Program pillars:

- Secure and sustainable food production (Na Mahi Hoʻokō Aʻe)
- Physical and mental well-being for the individual and community (Makana Training Center)
- Cultural exchanges to create shared experiences with other indigenous communities (Indigenous Warriors Initiative IWI Camp)

lwikua

In 2020 our farm moved to the Waimea High School (WHS) campus, in a rare opportunity to collaborate with the school to impact more students and provide them with exposure to a productive and thriving farm. Iwikua's two-acre farm offers hands-on educational opportunities for West Kaua'i youth, providing a learning experience in aquaponics and farming, from seed to sale. In collaboration with (but NOT DOE-affiliated) Waimea High School, Iwikua has been established as an alternative learning space for students struggling to maintain a GPA for graduation. This program creates a supportive and nurturing environment, enabling students who struggle with traditional school methodologies to acquire new hard and soft skill sets. The goal is to facilitate a smooth transition into a positive post-high-school career environment.

Makana Training Center is a community fitness center that also serves as a community hub, farm store, and gathering space to facilitate classes, competitions, and educational workshops. Makana Training Center is an inclusive fitness space with affordable memberships for West Kaua'i community members.

lwikua provides dynamic workforce development sites in partnership with value-aligned community organizations. Through internships, participants are equipped with the skills to operate a profitable farm enterprise or manage a fitness facility.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

As our organization and associated programming continue to grow and evolve, we will require additional funding for additional management positions:

- WHS Student Outreach Coordinator/Farm Program Director
- Makana Training Center Program Director
- 3. The public purpose and need to be served;

These positions are critical to public engagement and meaningful interactions with our target population:

A WHS Student Outreach Coordinator / Farm Program Director is a key member of the team moving forward. Iwikua is developing a farm curriculum that is closely tied to academic standards and framework. The farm is also an alternative learning space for students struggling with traditional methodologies and modalities associated with inclass learning. The Student Outreach Coordinator / Farm Program Director helps bridge the gap between the teachers, students, and the farm. This position is key to accurate data collection, and managing groups that visit the farm for educational purposes. By filling this position, we can have more meaningful and impactful interactions with both students and teachers. This position intersects with our IWI Camp/cultural programming as this position is in charge of coordinating with off-island groups that visit our farm.

A Program Director is vital for the growth of Makana Training Center and its associated programs. The director will focus on expanding the involvement and participation of the broader West Kaua'i community and streamlining afterschool programming for WHS and Waimea Canyon Middle School students. This involves organizing classes,

workshops, community competitions, and large community runs. We are also working on a program that connects health outcomes and determinants to our organic food production and fitness activities. This position intersects with our IWI Camp/cultural programming as this position is in charge of coordinating with off-island groups that visit Makana Training Center.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

Our farm programs target West Kaua'i youth from the communities of Kekaha, Waimea, and Hanapēpē. Our Makana Training Center programs focus first on the West Kaua'i communities of Kekaha, Waimea, and Hanapēpē, but also extend to the broader Kaua'i community. Our runs and competitions are open to all community members, as well as visitors.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The lwikua farm sits on two acres on the Waimea High School campus. Our aquaponics system consists of 12 raceways and 3 water tanks that accommodate 1,300 gallons of water. Our system produces about 20,000 lbs of lettuce annually. In addition to lettuce, the farm produces:

Banana Kalo Mango Lemon Lime Grapefruit Tomato Microgreens Carrots Kale Poultry

For a small amount of space, this farm is highly diversified with Kaua'i's largest aquaponics system, an orchard, and in-ground row crops—a true example of how farmers can thrive in the face of land scarcity.

Makana Training Center is a 3,500-square-foot facility, located in the heart of Waimea Town.

We have an "active" board that is involved in oversight of the lwikua, and the Executive Director reports on staffing progress at board meetings.

These positions will report to the Executive Director who manages the rest of the daily operations and staffing for lwikua.

For Na Mahi Hoʻokō Aʻe (the farm), key metrics include tracking school groups visiting, assessing the impact on WHS students through the farm curriculum, documenting meaningful interactions, monitoring the transition of students to farm interns, and tracking those who pursue careers in agriculture. Qualitative and anecdotal data will also be collected.

For Makana Training Center, effectiveness will be measured by community engagement, the the number of students enrolled in afterschool MTC programs, the successful implementation of new programs, participation in community classes, data and tracking on health outcomes and determinants.

These measures will serve as standardized and objective indicators reported to the State agency overseeing grant funds, ensuring an accurate assessment of program achievements.

His expertise extends beyond farming, encompassing agroforestry, viticulture, and traditional Hawaiian Methodologies. In spring 2023, Josh instructed Native Food Systems at Montana State University. As an Executive Director, his experience aligns with the organization's goals of overall community wellness.

lwikua will continue an aggressive grant-writing approach to supplement funding in addition to expanding current income streams. Our grants and development team will continue to write for programmatic funding as well as write for unrestricted funds from private foundations. We have never pursued State or Federal Funding, but would like to begin in 2024.

As a non-profit organization, lwikua has achieved some measure of financial sustainability by generating a consistent revenue stream to help cover operational expenses, reducing dependence on grants and philanthropic donations. The farm yields approximately 20,000 pounds of lettuce each year, sold to established commercial accounts and directly to the community. Our storefront at Makana Training Center, in

the heart of Waimea, serves as a direct outlet for the local community to access fresh and organic produce.

For both of these positions, we would like to provide a \$60,000 base salary. Iwikua will put up one third of the funds for the fiscal year 2024-2025, as we have already raised the funds. We would like the GIA-OP to "bridge the gap" in funding.
