II. Background and Summary

- 1. Kona Aloha Singers (KAS), a non-sectarian 501(c)(3) non-profit community chorus, requests funding in the amount of \$12,500.00 to support the artistic and musical development of the group. The focus for the funding would be to strengthen the personnel and specialists required to manage a community chorus. The funds would secure the existing artistic director, assistant director, music director (who currently is also the accompanist), as well as a band with 8-12 instruments, which is necessary to produce exceptional musical quality for our public performances. Additionally, we seek increased AV funding to address challenges with low-quality Audio/Visual support in our previous concerts where the chorus couldn't be heard over the band, microphones didn't work and the feedback from the speakers made it so the whole experience for the audience and the chorus members and band was challenging. Therefore, we aim to enhance the quality of our performances, rehearsals, and community outreach efforts through sustaining our dedicated artistic team, musicians and AV contractors.
- 2. Kona Aloha Singers' mission is to enrich our community's cultural life through musical performances that empower artistic growth and lifelong friendships within our chorus. We celebrate the sound of the 20th and 21st centuries and honor the contemporary artists whose music connects us all.

- 3. The Kona Aloha Singers was founded by Ilene Cohen Harrington in 2018. At that time Kona only had one community choir who sings classical music.
- 4. In 2016, when llene first conceived the idea for KAS, there were no choruses offering a pop/rock music repertoire. It took a couple of years to put the chorus together, and the first full concert year was in 2019. After a 2½ year COVID-19 break, KAS started again in 2022 and is looking to continue pioneering the contemporary community chorus model in Kailua-Kona.
- 5. In 2018 Kona Aloha Singers obtained IRS 501c3 status.
- 6. Since inception, The Kona Aloha Singers, as a dedicated musical group in Kailua-Kona, play a crucial role in enhancing the cultural experiences of our community. No other organization provides the same, or similar, cultural programming as KAS.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes
