To Whom It May Concern:

The Outdoor Circle has been protecting, preserving and advocating for Hawaii's scenic and natural beauty since 1912. We have branches all over the islands which serve their various communities and focus on specific issues important to their areas.

The historic and iconic grove of banyan trees on Banyan Drive in Hilo are emblematic of Hawaii's beauty and have been enjoyed by residents since 1933 as a cornerstone of the Waiakea Peninsula. Unfortunately, neglectful care and infestation with gall wasp has left the grove vulnerable. In our grant request, we seek to treat 46 of the 49 trees in the grove to rid them of gall wasps. We also seek to do companion tree plantings to allow time for the grove to have replacement trees when the originals reach the ends of their lives. We aim to provide certified arborist's care and will oversee planting and maintenance of new trees, provide new signage and work to make the area more inviting for local and visitors alike.

The public is served because these trees are where celebrations spanning generations have come locally, where visitors have stood in awe of Hawaii's beauty with this incomparable grove as the gateway to East Hawaii. They also provide huge ecoservice system benefits, a cooling effect in heated days, and an aesthetic that is vital for wellbeing in the area. The public benefits by the continued majesty of this grove in Hilo for the century to come.

Our target population is the entirely of the East Hawaii Island community. Residents of all ages enjoy this area as do all visitors who come to Hilo and environs. To Whom It May Concern:

The grant request we are making to treat and have companion plantings for Banyan Drive include:

46 trees treated with Safari insecticide three times each administered by professional and certified arborist. This will be at day 1, day 150 and day 300 of the year of the grant.

49 companion trees planted near each current tree, but which are resistant to gall wasp, to allow for growth to maintain the grove as original trees reach their lifespan with care and maintenance for two years after planting. This will be accomplished during the first six months to year of the grant, with care following totaling two years.

The Outdoor Circle will monitor for quality assurance and evaluations to see effectiveness of treatment and care for companion plantings on a quarterly basis, working with the certified arborist to evaluate together effectiveness and efficacy of the treatments and care for new trees in line with best practices of the International Society for Aboriculture, ANSI A-300 and other best practices.

We will report to the State of Hawaii the results of the treatments with an arborist's report to confirm, as well as our own reports, as would be expected with any tree care maintenance and planting scheme.
