The Queen's Health Systems is the largest private, nonprofit acute care medical facility in Hawaii, including four hospitals: Punchbowl Campus, West Oahu Campus, North Hawaii Campus, and Molokai Campus. We have 674 staffed beds between these sites. We also serve outpatient care in the same communities. Our mission is: to fulfill the intent of Queen Emma and King Kamehameha IV to provide, in perpetuity, quality healthcare services to improve the well-being of Native Hawaiians and all the People of Hawaii.

We are seeking funding for three registered nurses (RN) that provide care that is not Currently reimbursed by health insurance. These RN provide unreimbursed care that covers: care management - services to support primary care physicians in the treatment of complex patients; transitional care management that helps reduce potentially preventable readmissions to the emergency department and hospital as well as medical errors; complex care coordination and disease Management that includes disease specific education, testing and treatment, including treatment with culturally attuned programs (including hula).

Our broader goal of this program includes increasing access to overall health care for at risk population – including those with chronic illness. This work seeks to reduce pressure on our already stressed emergency departments at Queen's Manamana (Punchbowl) and West campuses while also lowering the work burden for our primary care physicians and hospitalists. This has an impact to the reduction in overall cost of care while also drastically improving health outcomes for our most at risk communities throughout Oahu. In particular this coordinated and specialized care aims to benefit the Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and Filipino communities.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

Mia is a diploma RN and earned her master's degree in nursing from Michigan State University and her bachelor's degree at psychology and sociology from Aquinas College in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Scott Whiting, Senior Vice President, Chief Population Health Officer, and Queen's Development Corporation President. Whiting manages partnerships and contracts with managed care organizations, and works with Queen's Clinically Integrated Physician Network leadership to define the needs of the market with regard to network development. Whiting has a Master of Business Administration from Harvard Business School, and a Bachelor of Arts in Genetics from Dartmouth College.
