- 1. This grant will be used for homeless youth and others who may need help.
- 2. The grant will allow Rainbow Family 808 to purchase necessary fresh fruits, vegetables, and dairy on a weekly basis for Residential Youth Services and Empowerment and Youth Outreach as needed. We can also provide special items at various holidays throughout the year. We will also help others who are referred and need items to allow them to have a living space or necessary items to help them get established for housing or food.
- 3. The primary target group is homeless youth.
- 4. The cost of grant is \$10,200.

II. Background and Summary

- 1. Rainbow Family 808 is a 501(c)(3) group of Straight and LGBT families dedicated to peace & justice through education and support. The focus is on assisting Youth Outreach (YO) of Waikiki center for all homeless youth who are living on the streets, and Residential Youth Services and Empowerment (RYSE) where houseless young adults can find shelter, and a variety of services. We collect funds, food and clothes for homeless youth and work for permanent shelters for them. We also help any other person or organization that may need our assistance. We believe at Rainbow Family 808 love makes a family.
- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request allow some relief in raising funds so we can continue our goals of providing the houseless youth and others the items needed to survive and better their situation. We believe the grant help definitely helps those we serve. In turn, it will allow others to focus on other requirements like education, training, housing, and job or school placement.
- 1. The public purpose and need to be served. To help homeless youth on Oahu so they do not need to get into criminal or other activities like the sex trade.
- 2. Describe the target population to be served. From the statistics provided by RYSE and YO, we know that at least 125 youth live on the streets of Oahu at any time. We do what we can to help them have a chance to overcome their homeless. They are on the streets because be abused at home, including. Foster homes, being LBGTQ+, or sexual abuse to name a few reasons.
- 3. Describe the geographic coverage. Although we deliver to RYSE on the Windward side and YO in Waikiki, we know there are needs on other parts of Oahu. When we are aware of needs, we go help on any part of Oahu.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

The applicant shall:

- 1. Our scope of work is asking Youth Outreach and Residential Youth Services and Empowerment on a weekly basis what they need. We usually purchase items at Costco or other locations to supplement items that these organization do not normally receive from other resources. This includes milk, other diary items, other food and non-food items requested. There are times we have special request from the above-mentioned organizations and others for specific requests. This could be large and tall clothing, bedding materials, furniture, new shoes and socks. We provide what we can through the funds we raise for those purposes.
- 2. We provided what is requested weekly and we know that there is usually special request at various holidays like July 4th, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.
- 3. We know that there is usually a weekly request throughout the calendar year. We also ask what there special requests will be so we can plan and buy within the funds we have available. When there is an unusual request, we go out through social media to raise additional funds to cover those needs. In the past, we have been successful to help in those special requests.
- 4. We track our weekly expenditures. As such, we can limit how much we spend. When necessary, we let people know through social media when additional resources are needed to help the youth or others in need.
- 5. We maintain all receipts and a copy of our donation form and the response from the organization that they donations are provided. We do a similar process for individual request where we are able to provide donations.

7) Experience and Capability

Rainbow Family 808 has been in existence since January 24, 2014. Since its inception, the goal is to help those in need. Although we are willing to help all individuals and/or families, our focus has been the homeless youth.

Over the years, we have been able to raise funds to allow us to provide fresh produce, dairy and other requested products to Youth Outreach (YO) and Residential Youth Services and Empowerment (RYSE).

We have also raised funds to help a family establish a home so they could have their son returned. When Barbers Point Elementary School needed a washer and dryer to continue to provide clean clothes for the homeless youth at their school, we were able to raise the funds to buy them. We also provided needed shelving, new clothes, and cleaning supplies.

Each week for almost eight years we provide weekly food and other items that YO and/or RYSE cannot get through the Foodbank or other places. This allows them to use their funds for their other programs or needs.

We have been able to do this primarily through donations we raise via social media or other fundraising efforts.

When we have sufficient donations, we are able to provide additional items during the holidays. In the past five years, we have raised funds to purchase items, suchbackpacks, flashlights, socks, underwear, other requested cloth items, food items, survival blankets, toothbrushes, and toothpaste, individual first aid kits, and Foodland \$10 gift cards.

Although it has been harder to raise funds due to the economy and the effects of COVID, Rainbow Family 808 has continued to receive donations. We were also able to receive non-profit COVID relief funds from the City and County of Honolulu that allowed us to provide the needed support for those we service.

Since no one is paid, the funds we received are used to the maximum extent to support RYSE and YO and others in need.
