A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section 26-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amen	ding subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) The	department shall:
4	(1) Preau	dit and conduct after-the-fact audits of the
5	finar	cial accounts of all state departments to
6	deter	mine the legality of expenditures and the
7	accur	acy of accounts;
8	(2) Repor	t to the governor and to each regular session of
9	the 1	egislature as to the finances of each department
10	of th	ne State;
11	(3) Admir	nister the state risk management program;
12	(4) Estab	olish and manage motor pools;
13	(5) Manag	ge the preservation and disposal of all records of
14	the S	State;
15	(6) Under	take the program of centralized engineering and
16	offic	ce leasing services, including operation and
17	maint	enance and lease buyback processing pursuant to

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1		subsection (d) of public buildings, for departments of		
2		the State;		
3	(7)	Undertake the functions of the state surveyor;		
4	(8)	Establish accounting and internal control systems;		
5	(9)	Have the discretion to employ persons within the		
6		comptroller's office who shall be exempt from chapters		
7		76 and 89 in support of communications, change		
8		management, and business process improvement programs		
9		as part of the State's information technology		
10		modernization efforts; provided that the persons shall		
11		be members of the state employees' retirement system		
12		and shall be eligible to receive the benefits of any		
13		state employee benefit program generally applicable to		
14		officers and employees of the State;		
15	[(9)]	(10) Under the direction of the chief information		
16		officer, provide centralized computer information		
17		management and processing services;		
18	[(10)]	(11) Establish a program to provide a means for		
19		public access to public information and develop an		
20		information network for state government;		

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1	[(11)]	(12)	Assume administrative responsibility for the
2		offic	ce of information practices; and
3	[(12)]	(13)	Approve state fleet acquisitions; provided that:
4		(A)	Beginning January 1, 2022, all new light-duty
5			motor vehicles that are passenger cars purchased
6			for the State's fleet shall be zero-emission
7			vehicles;
8		(B)	Beginning as soon as practicable but no later
9			than January 1, 2030, all new light-duty motor
10			vehicles that are multipurpose passenger vehicles
11			and trucks for the State's fleet shall be zero-
12			emission vehicles; and
13		(C)	The comptroller may authorize an exemption for
14			new fleet vehicle purchases if zero-emission
15			vehicles are demonstrated to be cost-prohibitive
16			on a lifecycle basis or unsuitable for the
17			vehicles' planned purpose, or if funds are
18			unavailable.
19	For	the p	urposes of this subsection:

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"Light-duty motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning as
 contained in title 10 Code [+]of[+] Federal Regulations part
 490.
 "Multipurpose passenger vehicle" shall have the same
 meaning as contained in title 49 Code of Federal Regulations

6 section 571.3.

7 "Passenger car" shall have the same meaning as contained in8 title 49 Code of Federal Regulations section 571.3.

9 "Truck" shall have the same meaning as contained in title
10 49 Code of Federal Regulations section 571.3.

11 "Zero-emission vehicle" shall have the same meaning as 12 contained in title 40 Code of Federal Regulations section 13 88.102-94."

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
