A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEATH BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's mortuaries 2 and cemeteries are inadequately compensated for cremating and 3 storing unclaimed human remains on behalf of the State. The 4 department of human services provides death benefits to cover 5 cremation and disposition costs for a deceased person who was 6 eligible for medical or financial assistance at the time of the 7 person's death and whose body is unclaimed. However, the amount 8 is not adequate to cover the mortuary's or cemetery's expenses. 9 Currently, the State offers \$800 in reimbursement to cover the 10 costs of transporting, cremating, storing, and handling the 11 final disposition of an unclaimed body. The Hawaii Funeral and 12 Cemetery Association estimates that the average market rate for 13 these services is approximately \$2,400. The rising costs of 14 fuel, labor, and materials make this pay discrepancy 15 unsustainable for the industry. If mortuaries and cemeteries are not more fairly compensated, they may begin to decline the 16

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase from \$800 to \$1,600 the amount of death benefits paid by the department of human services to cover the cremation and disposition costs for a deceased person who was eligible for medical or financial assistance at the time of the person's death and whose body is unclaimed.

9 SECTION 2. Section 346-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

11 "(b) All unclaimed dead human bodies shall undergo 12 cremation as defined in section 531B-2. The department may bear 13 the cost of the mortuary, crematory, or hydrolysis facility 14 services for unclaimed dead human bodies furnished by any licensed provider of these services. Payments for these 15 16 services shall be made to the extent of the cost, or in the sum 17 of [\$800] \$1,600 in total, whichever is less, for each unclaimed 18 dead human body. Individuals who have possession, charge, or 19 control of any unclaimed dead human body to undergo cremation at 20 public expense shall have sixty days from the date of the deceased's death to submit in writing to the department its 21

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1 determination that the dead human body is unclaimed and its 2 application for payment for cremation. The county medical 3 examiners or coroners shall have no time limitation by which to submit their written determination that the dead human body is 4 5 unclaimed and their application for payment for cremation." 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$277,600 or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to cover 9 the increased cremation and disposition costs for a deceased 10 person who was eliqible for medical or financial assistance at 11 the time of the person's death and whose body is unclaimed. 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 13 human services for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024. 16
