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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that serious motor 1 2 vehicle accidents are a growing concern in the State. Numerous crashes have occurred near schools and there are a number of 3 dangerous roads and intersections where fatalities and serious 4 5 injuries regularly occur. Even when dangerous areas are identified, safety improvements can still take years to 6 7 implement due to lengthy processes, resulting in more accidents and fatalities to occur that could have been avoided. 8 The purpose of this Act is to allow for expedient safety 9 improvements to dangerous areas to help make Hawaii's streets 10 11 safer by: 12 (1) Requiring the department of transportation and county 13 transportation agencies to define, regularly identify, and address high-risk and dangerous corridors and 14
