# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HARBOR SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require that the
- 2 securing of mooring lines from vessels to the State's commercial
- 3 docks, wharves, piers, quays, and landings be performed by labor
- 4 subject to collective bargaining, to ensure harbor safety by
- 5 employing highly skilled, experienced local longshore workers
- 6 who possess the intimate knowledge of Hawaiian waters and
- 7 mooring practices crucial for minimizing accidents and ensuring
- 8 optimal safety. As with any stevedoring job, mooring operations
- 9 carry significant risks, and accidents can have devastating
- 10 consequences, even death.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 "PART . MOORING OF VESSELS TO COMMERCIAL DOCKS
- 15 §266- Labor subject to collective bargaining; required.
- 16 In addition to the duties of the department of transportation
- 17 imposed under part I, the department of transportation shall

- 1 require that the securing of mooring lines from vessels to
- 2 commercial docks, wharves, piers, quays, and landings be
- 3 performed by labor subject to collective bargaining; provided
- 4 that nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring
- 5 that any labor being performed at any shipyard or drydock; by or
- 6 on behalf of any ship repair or construction company; or
- 7 involving any activity relating to ship repair, construction and
- 8 overhaul services, and maritime research and development be
- 9 subject to collective bargaining."
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall not be applied so as to impair
- 11 any contract existing as of the effective date of this Act in a
- 12 manner violative of either the Constitution of the State of
- 13 Hawaii or article I, section 10, of the United States
- 14 Constitution.
- 15 SECTION 4. The provisions of this Act shall be enforced to
- 16 the extent they are not held to conflict with any federal or
- 17 state constitutional provision, law, rule, or regulation. The
- 18 provisions of this Act are not severable and if any provision of
- 19 the Act, or the application thereof to any person or
- 20 circumstance is held to conflict with any federal or state

- 1 constitutional provision, law, rule, or regulation, this Act, in
- 2 its entirety, shall be invalid.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
