#### STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO SENATE BILL NO. 3068

Honorable Members Thirty-Second Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 3068, entitled "A Bill for an Act Making Appropriations for Wildfire Recovery."

The purpose of this bill is to appropriate funds to support the State's continued response to the August 2023 wildfires that affected the County of Maui.

This bill is objectionable because, while the bill appropriates funds to assist with the Maui wildfire recovery, the bill inadvertently zeroes out funding for the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to be used for affordable housing. To prevent delays in building affordable housing units for Hawaii residents, this bill cannot be enacted. Housing is a top priority for my Administration, along with the Maui wildfire recovery efforts. I intend to fully support the Maui wildfire recovery appropriations made in this bill through the Major Disaster Fund. The Supplemental Appropriations Bill of 2024, House Bill No. 1800, has sufficient appropriations that can be transferred to the Major Disaster Fund to support the Maui wildfire recovery efforts outlined in this bill.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 3068 without my approval.

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR WILDFIRE RECOVERY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

	DE II ENACTED DY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the devastating
2	wildfires brought on by winds from Hurricane Dora on August 8,
3	2023, resulted in one of the worst natural disasters in the
4	State's history. The wildfires caused loss of life and
5	displacement of thousands on the island of Maui. The disaster
6	also destroyed nearly all of Lahaina.
7	The people of Hawaii and the world responded
8	compassionately by coming together with donation drives and
9	relief efforts to support those on Maui who had survived the
10	devastation. Federal, state, and county agencies worked
11	together with nonprofit organizations, including the American
12	Red Cross, Hawaii Community Foundation, Maui United Way, and
13	many others, on the emergency response and recovery efforts.
14	The legislature further finds that to support response and
15	recovery efforts and address immediate 2023 wildfire funding
16	needs, the governor, through the seventh emergency proclamation
17	relating to wildfires, dated September 8, 2023, and executive

memorandum no. 23-08, redirected \$164.1 million, after

18

- 1 adjustments, from selected general fund operating appropriations
- 2 from Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, originally intended
- 3 for specific purposes and capital improvement projects, to the
- 4 department of budget and finance. The department of budget and
- 5 finance subsequently transferred \$65 million to the major
- 6 disaster fund and set aside the remaining \$99.1 million for the
- 7 State's share of noncongregate housing and debris clean-up costs
- 8 initially being paid by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
- 9 These steps, among others, allowed the State to address response
- 10 and recovery expenses incurred thus far without cutting
- 11 positions and departmental base budgets.
- 12 The legislature notes that this Act is a vital component to
- 13 funding wildfire recovery. In addition to significant funding
- 14 in this Act, the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2024
- 15 appropriates \$96,560,000 for various infrastructure projects on
- 16 Maui that include:
- 17 (1) \$4,560,000 for a final disposition site;
- 18 (2) \$11,000,000 for wastewater collection system repairs;
- 19 (3) \$9,000,000 for wastewater collection system laterals
- and cleanouts;
- 21 (4) \$3,000,000 for traffic signal replacement;

20	VII of th	e Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91

- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for fire

- 10 contracts for the department of land and natural resources,
- 11 division of forestry and wildlife.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 land and natural resources, native resources and fire protection
- 14 program (LNR 402), for the purposes of this section.
- 15 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,412,928 or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 18 twenty-two full-time equivalent (22.0 FTE) positions within the
- 19 native resources and fire protection program of the department
- 20 of land and natural resources.
