RELATING TO LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 465-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as follows:
3	1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
4	and to read as follows:
5	" "American Psychological Association" means the American
6	Psychological Association or its successor agency approved by
7	the board."
8	2. By amending the definition of "continuing education" to
9	read as follows:
10	""Continuing education" means courses approved by the
11	American Psychological Association, the Hawaii Psychological
12	Association, or other state or provincial psychological
13	Associations $[-]$, and continuing medical education courses that
14	are related to the practice of psychology and approved by the
15	American Medical Association or its successor agency approved by
16	the board."
17	3. By amending the definition of "institution of higher

18 education" to read as follows:

1 ""Institution of higher education" means a university, 2 professional school, or other institution of higher learning 3 that:

4	(1)	In the United States, is regionally accredited by	
5		bodies approved by [the Council on Postsecondary	
6		Accreditation and] the Council for Higher Education	
7		Accreditation or its successor agency approved by the	
8		board or the United States Department of Education; or	
9	(2)	In Canada, holds a membership in [the Association of	
10		Universities and Colleges of Canada; or] Universities	
11		Canada or its successor agency approved by the board.	
12	[(3) -	In other countries, is accredited by the respective	
13		official organization having such authority.]"	
14	4.	By amending the definition of "professional psychology	
15	training	program" to read as follows:	
16	""Pr	ofessional psychology training program" means a	
17	doctoral	training program that [includes (1) and (2), or (1) and	
18	(3) of the following:		
19	(1)	Is a planned program of study which reflects	
20		an integration of the science and practice of	
21		psychology including practica and internship; and	
22	(2) -	Is designated as a doctoral program in	

1		psychology by the Association of State and Provincial	
2		Psychology Boards and the National Register of Health	
3		Service Providers in Psychology or is accredited by	
4		the Canadian Psychological Association; or	
5	(3)	Is offered in a regionally accredited	
6		institution of higher education.] is a planned	
7		sequential program of study and training offered in an	
8		institution of higher education that reflects an	
9		integration of psychological science and practice to	
10		facilitate human development and functioning and	
11		prepares individuals to provide psychological services	
12		to the general public."	
13	SECTION 3. Section 465-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
14	amended to read as follows:		
15	"§465-7.5 Foreign graduates. [An applicant trained in an		
16	institution other than an institution of higher education as		
17	defined in this chapter must demonstrate to the satisfaction of		
18	the board that the applicant possesses a doctoral degree in		
19	psychology, the requirements for which are substantially similar		
20	to the requirements for a doctoral degree in professional		
21	psychology as required in this chapter. The board shall		
22	consider the certification of the graduate division of the		

1	University of Hawaii that the degree from the foreign university			
2	is equivalent to a doctoral degree granted from an institution			
3	of higher education as defined in this chapter.] (a) An			
4	applicant who holds a doctoral degree in psychology trained in			
5	an institution other than an institution of higher education as			
6	defined in section 465-1 must demonstrate to the satisfaction of			
7	the board that the requirements for the doctoral degree are			
8	substantially similar to the requirements for a doctoral degree			
9	in professional psychology training program as required in			
10	section 465-7(a)(1)(B). The board may consider the			
11	certification by a current member agency of the National			
12	Association of Credential Evaluation Services that the doctoral			
13	degree from the foreign university is equivalent to a doctoral			
14	degree granted from an institution of higher education as			
15	defined in section 465-1; and			
16	(b) Regardless of country of origin, a master's degree in			
17	psychology shall not have parity with a doctoral degree in			
18	professional psychology as required for licensure by this			
19	chapter and shall not be used to meet the education requirements			
20	for licensure."			
21	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed			
22	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Commerce and Consumer Affairs

- TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS.
- PURPOSE: To add and update definitions related to education and training requirements of psychologists and amend the application review process for those applicants whose doctoral degree was obtained in a foreign institution.
- MEANS: Amends sections 465-1 and 465-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).
- JUSTIFICATION: The Hawaii Board of Psychology (Board) administers chapter 465, HRS, and finds that the chapter has outdated definitions and provisions that make administration unnecessarily complex related to the education and training of applicants and licensees, as well as the review process of foreign educated applicants.

To resolve these issues, the Board proposes to add the definition of "American Psychological Association," expand the definition of "continuing education," and further clarify the definitions of "institution of higher education" and "professional psychology training program." Further changes are proposed to make the review process of foreign educated applicants by the Board congruent with the new definitions and current national practices.

<u>Impact on the public</u>: Updating the definitions and provisions related to the education and training of psychologists, including those that are foreign educated, will ensure that psychologists accessed by the public meet current educational standards and be able to provide safe and effective care.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Updating the definitions and further clarifying the screening process of foreign educated applicants set forth by section 465-7.5, HRS, will reduce the time and use of resources spent by the Board on unnecessary issues caused by misunderstanding and misinterpretation of the statutes' complex language on the subject.
