
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 205, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, mandates
2 that the department of education create a quarterly report about
3 students with autism spectrum disorder, staffing requirements,
4 and Medicaid reimbursements. However, the quarterly report is a
5 burdensome reporting requirement for the department with few
6 changes between each period. Changing the requirement to an
7 annual report would provide a more equitable balance between an
8 informational report and additional workload.

9 The purpose of this Act is to amend the Act 205, Session
10 Laws of Hawaii 2018, reporting period from quarterly to annual.

11 SECTION 2. Act 205, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, Section
12 6, is amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

13 "(c) After the submission of the initial report to the
14 legislature and board of education pursuant to subsection (b),
15 the department of education shall submit [~~quarterly reports~~] an
16 annual report to the legislature and board of education;
17 provided that the [~~quarterly reports~~] annual report shall

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EDUCATION.

PURPOSE: To change the Department of Education's (Department) quarterly report on autism spectrum disorder to an annual report.
