A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a severe 2 shortage of mental health providers in the State. This shortage 3 is due to a lack of appropriately educated individuals and high 4 rates of turnover in the field, which is exacerbated by 5 compassion fatigue, burnout, and inadequate preparation for 6 mental health serving positions. The legislature therefore 7 finds that the mental health provider shortage in the State 8 addressed by this measure is a matter of statewide concern. 9 The legislature further finds that the university of Hawaii 10 Windward community college, in collaboration with the Hawaii 11 state hospital, has developed a mental health technician 12 certificate of competence program. The coursework for the 13 certificate program addresses the immediate and critical 14 workforce needs of preparing potential employees and upskilling 15 existing employees. These certificates are also a foundation to increasingly higher qualifications, as the initial certificate 16 of competence opens a pathway to further training and 17

1 development. A one-year certificate program currently under 2 development will build on the skills developed by the existing 3 mental health technician certificate of competence program by 4 adding clinical skills and knowledge necessary to perform higher 5 job requirements in more advanced clinical settings. The 6 coursework can also be applied toward baccalaureate degrees. 7 These programs help to grow the State's overall capacity to 8 address the mental health challenges and needs of Hawaii's 9 residents.

10 The mental health technician certificate of competence 11 program consists of three approved courses, which provide a 12 basic foundation in mental health knowledge in a short-term, 13 focused program of study available in person and online. The 14 asynchronous online courses can be offered to mental health 15 workers and students across the State, with Windward community 16 college coordinating with other community colleges in the 17 university of Hawaii system. In order for the program to be offered statewide, additional resources are needed to provide 18 19 for key personnel and establish a scholarship program to 20 increase access to the mental health technician certificate of 21 competence program for individuals who are unemployed,
