A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEMP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is important to 2 establish a task force to bring together hemp industry 3 stakeholders, the department of agriculture, and the department 4 of health to identify strategies and actions to best support and 5 grow the Hawaii hemp industry. Through data development and 6 information exchange, the task force can help to shape hemp 7 policy and programming to support Hawaii agriculture, consumers, 8 and the public interest.

9 The legislature also finds that although hemp is a high-10 value crop that has the potential to bring significant and diverse revenues to Hawaii, the industry has been stymied 11 12 because of factors including limited market access and 13 overregulation of production and processing, which have driven 14 Hawaii hemp farmers out of business; made Hawaii hemp farmers 15 noncompetitive; and created challenges for hemp building, 16 housing, and biofuel projects. Hawaii is the only state in the country that regulates hemp farming at the state level but has 17

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also asked for regulation by the United States Department of
Agriculture.

3 The legislature further finds that the state department of 4 agriculture and department of health have worked to be 5 responsive to changing federal and state hemp regulations. 6 Creation of a task force will provide a forum for regular 7 interactions among the Hawaii hemp industry and experts to help 8 to identify data that will facilitate the implementation of 9 policy and save agency time and resources.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to convene a Hawaii hemp industry task force in the department of agriculture to gather data and information to aid in the understanding of hemp industry needs and recommend to the legislature strategies and actions to support a vibrant hemp industry, agriculture, and rural economic development.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a Hawaii hemp 17 industry task force within the department of agriculture for 18 administrative purposes. The task force shall consist of the 19 following members:

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1	(1)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the
2		chairperson's designee, who shall serve as the
3		chairperson of the task force;
4	(2)	The director of health or the director's designee;
5	(3)	The chairperson of the house of representatives
6		standing committee with primary jurisdiction over
7		agriculture;
8	(4)	Seven members comprised of hemp farmers from each
9		island with existing hemp production, proportionate to
10		the total number of United States Department of
11		Agriculture hemp licenses in the State, who shall be
12		selected by the task force members identified in
13		paragraphs (1) to (3); and
14	(5)	One member from each of the following five hemp
15		production sectors, all of whom shall be residents of
16		the State, who shall be selected by the task force
17		members identified in paragraphs (1) to (3):
18		(A) Fuel;
19		(B) Building;
20		(C) General fiber;
21		(D) Cannabinoid; and

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1		(E) Grain food.
2	(b)	The task force shall dissolve on June 30, 2024.
3	(C)	Members of the task force shall serve without
4	compensati	ion.
5	(d)	The task force shall:
6	(1)	Gather data and information from sources, including
7		hemp economists, regulators in other states,
8		retailers, farmers, and hemp industry groups outside
9		of Hawaii;
10	(2)	Develop an outline, not a study, of farmer and
11		industry needs and strategies and actions to inform
12		public policy regarding the creation of a vibrant hemp
13		industry in Hawaii that is supportive of local
14		agriculture; and
15	(3)	Report to the legislature its findings and
16		recommendations based on input, information, and data
17		gathered.
18	(e)	The department of agriculture shall provide any
19	necessary	administrative support, including preparation of the
20	report red	quired by subsection (f), to the task force.

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(f) The task force shall submit a report of its findings 1 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 2 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 3 the regular session of 2024. 4 5

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
