### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 134-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(c) No person shall carry concealed or unconcealed on the
4	person a pistol or revolver without being licensed to do so
5	under this section or in compliance with sections 134-5(c) or
6	134-25. Except as otherwise provided by federal or state law,
7	no person who has a valid license pursuant to this section shall
8	carry upon their person a pistol or revolver outside of the
9	person's residence without having the valid license in the
10	person's immediate possession, or fail to display the same upon
11	the demand of a law enforcement officer when being lawfully
12	detained; provided that this prohibition shall not apply to:
13	(1) Qualified law enforcement officers and qualified
14	retired law enforcement officers pursuant to title 18
15	United States Code sections 926B and 926C and this
16	chapter who have documentation regarding their
17	qualifications in their immediate possession; and
