A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The commission on water resource 2 management and division of aquatic resources of the department of land and natural resources, in partnership with the 3 4 University of Hawaii, shall conduct research on limu to 5 understand the impacts of groundwater use on groundwater-6 dependent ecosystems. 7 (b) No later than twenty days before the regular session of 2026, the commission on water resource management, division 8 9 of aquatic resources of the department of land and natural 10 resources, and University of Hawaii shall submit to the 11 legislature a joint report of their findings and 12 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, concerning 13 their research on limu and the impacts of groundwater use on 14 groundwater-dependent ecosystems.

15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the

same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
2024-2025 for research on limu to understand the impacts of
groundwater use on groundwater-dependent ecosystems.
The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
