

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHER SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. State law currently protects fishers from
harassment if they are taking fish pursuant to a freshwater game
fishing license. The legislature finds that there is a need to
extend these protections to all persons fishing in marine waters
to promote the safety and enjoyment of individuals engaged in
fishing activities.

7 The legislature further finds that Makai Watch is an 8 official program of the department of land and natural resources 9 that enhances protection of nearshore and coastal resources by 10 providing community members opportunities to work and interact 11 with resource managers and enforcement officers in their 12 community. The Makai Watch program plays an important role as 13 the eyes and ears of the division of conservation and resources 14 enforcement. Makai Watch volunteers participate in two types of 15 activities:

16 (1) Observation and incident reporting; and

17 (2) Awareness raising and outreach.



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Volunteers in the Makai Watch program are trained to conduct 1 2 these activities in a manner that does not interfere with 3 fishing activities. 4 The purpose of this Act is to: 5 (1) Prohibit purposeful harassment with the intent to 6 prevent the taking of fish for people who are fishing; 7 and 8 (2) Extend protections against harassment to all persons 9 fishing in marine waters. SECTION 2. Section 188-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "[4] §188-71[]] Harassment of fishermen; prohibition. (a) 13 No person shall intentionally prevent or attempt to prevent the 14 lawful taking of fish by a person [licensed pursuant to section 15 188-50] fishing in state waters by [+] purposely: 16 (1) Placing the person's self in a location in which human presence may affect the behavior of fish to be taken 17 18 or the feasibility of taking such fish; 19 Creating a visual, aural, olfactory, or physical (2) 20 stimulus to affect the behavior of fish to be taken;



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1	(3) Affecting the condition or placement of personal
2	property intended for use in the taking; or
3	(4) Obstructing the person's access to areas in which the
4	person intends to lawfully take fish[-],
5	with the intent to prevent the taking of fish.
6	(b) No person shall enter or remain upon public lands or
7	waters, or upon private lands or waters, without permission of
8	the owner or the owner's agent, with intent to violate this
9	section.
10	(c) It shall not be a violation of subsection (a) to:
11	(1) Take photographs or video recording of a person
12	engaged in the taking of fish or related activities
13	while over one hundred feet away from the person; or
14	(2) Engage in activities pursuant to the department of
15	land and natural resources' makai watch program.
16	$\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ The maximum penalty for violation of subsection
17	(a) or (b) is a fine of \$500, thirty days imprisonment, or
18	both."
19	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
20	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
21	begun before its effective date.

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SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
