A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO USE OF FORCE IN SELF-PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 703-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§703-304 Use of force in self-protection. (1) Subject
4 to the provisions of this section and [of] section 703-308, the
5 use of force upon or toward another person is justifiable when
6 the actor believes that [such] the use of force is immediately
7 necessary for the purpose of protecting [himself] oneself
8 against the use of unlawful force by the other person on the
9 present occasion.

10 (2) The use of deadly force is justifiable under this
11 section if the actor believes that deadly force is necessary to
12 protect [himself] <u>oneself</u> against death, serious bodily injury,
13 kidnapping, rape, or forcible sodomy.

14 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (4) and
15 (5) [of this section], a person employing protective force may
16 estimate the necessity thereof under the circumstances as [he]
17 <u>the person</u> believes them to be when the force is used without

SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
