A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 386-21.9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]\$386-21.9[+] Medical care, services, and supplies for
- 4 firefighters and solid waste workers suffering from cancer. (a)
- 5 If a claim for leukemia, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma,
- 6 or cancer of the lung, brain, stomach, esophagus, intestines,
- 7 rectum, kidney, bladder, prostate, or testes filed by an
- 8 employee with five or more years of service as a firefighter or
- 9 solid waste worker with five or more years of service with
- 10 significant regular exposure to trash is accepted or determined
- 11 to be compensable, section 386-21 shall remain applicable;
- 12 provided that the employer shall be liable for medical care,
- 13 services, and supplies for a minimum of one hundred ten per
- 14 cent, and not to exceed one hundred fifty per cent of fees
- 15 prescribed in the Medicare Resource Based Relative Value Scale
- 16 applicable to Hawaii as prepared by the United States Department
- 17 of Health and Human Services.

- 1 (b) For the purposes of this section, "solid waste worker"
- 2 means an employee of a government facility handling solid waste.
- 3 "Solid waste worker" includes municipal solid waste employees
- 4 who work at facilities such as transfer stations and solid waste
- 5 collectors."
- 6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Requires employers to be liable for medical care, services, and supplies when a workers' compensation claim filed by a solid waste worker suffering from cancer is accepted. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
