#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THEFT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the surge in theft 2 perpetrated by organized retail crime rings is threatening 3 communities and businesses in Hawaii. According to the National 4 Retail Federation's 2022 National Retail Security Survey, 5 businesses saw a 26.5 per cent increase in organized retail 6 crime incidents. These crimes not only affect large department 7 stores but small businesses which comprise 99 per cent of the business landscape in the islands. 8

9 To malicious actors, these crimes are considered low-risk 10 and yield a high-reward. To address this pervasive issue, nine 11 states passed laws in 2022 increasing penalties for organized retail theft. Hawaii, ranking fifth among states for highest 12 13 average total value of stolen goods per resident, needs to join this nationwide response to combat organized retail theft. 14 The 15 purpose of this Act is to create the offense of organized retail 16 theft and provide penalties accordingly.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§</u> 70	8- Organized retail theft. (1) For purposes of this

6	"Retailer" means a person or business that sells or		
7	facilitates the sale of merchandise to the public for use or		
8	consumption rather than for resale.		
9	(2)	A person commits the offense of organized retail theft	
10	if the person intentionally:		
11	<u>(a)</u>	Acts in concert with one or more persons to commit	
12		theft of merchandise from one or more retailers with	
13		intent to sell, exchange, or dispose of the	
14		merchandise for value; or	
15	<u>(b)</u>	Acts in concert with one or more persons to receive,	
16		possess, conceal, store, or purchase merchandise	
17		explicitly represented to the person as being	
18		merchandise stolen from a retailer.	
19	(3)	Violation of this section is:

15	<u>(i)</u>	Four members, appointed by the governor, one of		
16		whom shall be an individual who represents state		
17		or local law enforcement;		
18	<u>(ii)</u>	President, or their designee, of the Chamber of		
19		Commerce Hawaii;		
20	<u>(iii)</u>	President, or their designee, of the Retail		
21		Merchants of Hawaii;

2		City and County of Honolulu;

9	<u>(b)</u> Ap	ppointments to the task force shall be made by the
10	ar	ppointing authority no later than sixty days after

12	<u>(c)</u> <u>T</u>	ne members of the task force shall serve without
13	<u>cc</u>	ompensation. No member of the task force shall be
14	ma	ade subject to section 84-17, solely because of that
15	me	ember's participation on the task force. The task
16	fc	orce shall be exempt from chapter 92.
17	<u>(d)</u> <u>T</u> ł	ne task force shall submit a report of its findings
18	ar	nd recommendations, including any proposed
19	<u>le</u>	egislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
20	da	ays prior to the convening of the regular session of

SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
