A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOUR GUIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to title 25 to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	TOUR GUIDES
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context clearly requires otherwise:
8	"Compensation" means any money, tip, donation, thing of
9	value, or economic benefit conferred on or received by any
10	person in return for services rendered or to be rendered to
11	another.
12	"Department" means the department of commerce and consumer
13	affairs.
14 .	"Director" means the director of commerce and consumer
15	affairs.
16	"Practice of tour guiding" means speaking to one or more
17	persons at any county or state historic site, park, garden,

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road, sidewalk, or point of interest for the purpose of
 explaining, describing, or conveying information relevant to
 that location.

4 "Vehicle" includes any taxicab, bus, motor vehicle,
5 locomotive, car, trolley, train, airplane, submarine, or boat.

6 § -2 Tour guide licensing program. There is established
7 a tour guide licensing program within the department to be
8 administered by the director.

9 § -3 Prohibited acts. (a) Except as specifically
10 provided in this chapter, no person shall engage in the practice
11 of tour guiding in exchange for compensation or use the title of
12 "licensed tour guide" or "tour guide" without a valid license
13 issued under this chapter.

(b) Any person who violates this section shall be subject
to a fine of not more than \$1,000 for each separate offense.
Each day of each violation shall constitute a separate offense.
Any action taken to impose or collect the fine imposed under
this section shall be a civil action.

19 (c) This section shall not apply to:

20 (1) Any government employee acting within the scope of the
21 person's employment;

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1	(2)	The operator of any vehicle while the operator:
2		(A) Speaks to passengers in the vehicle; and
3		(B) Operates the vehicle for the primary purpose of
4		transporting passengers;
5	(3)	Any person duly licensed who is acting within the
6		course and scope of the person's licensed profession;
7	(4)	Tour guides employed by a museum, amusement park, or
8		other entity and for which the majority of the tour
9		occurs on property that is not owned by the State or
10		any county; and
11	(5)	Tour guides engaging in the practice of tour guiding
12		as an employee of a private, nonprofit, tax-exempt
13		corporation, association, or organization pursuant to
14		section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
15		amended, that is domiciled in this State.
16	Ş	-4 Powers and duties of the director. In addition to
17	any other	powers and duties authorized by law, the director
18	shall hav	e the powers and duties to:
19	(1)	Grant a tour guide license to a person to use the
20		title of "tour guide" or a description indicating a
21		person is a licensed tour guide in this State;

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1	(2)	Adopt, amend, or repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91
2		to carry out this chapter;
3	(3)	Administer, coordinate, and enforce this chapter;
4	(4)	Discipline a licensed tour guide for any due cause
5		described by this chapter or violation of the rules;
6	(5)	Refuse to license a person for failure to meet
7		licensing requirements or on grounds sufficient to
8		discipline a licensed tour guide;
9	(6)	Appoint an advisory committee consisting of licensed
10		tour guides, members of the visitor industry, members
11		of the University of Hawaii, commissioners or
12		employees of the public utilities commission, and
13		members of the public to assist with the
14		implementation of this chapter and adoption of rules;
15		provided that the initial members of the committee who
16		are tour guides shall not be required to be licensed
17		pursuant to this chapter; and
18	(7)	In consultation with the advisory council:
19		(A) Adopt a code of ethics for tour guides; and

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1 (B) Establish annual continuing education 2 requirements necessary to renew a tour guide 3 license. 4 S -5 Application for licensure as a tour guide. Subject 5 to section -9, the department shall issue a license to an 6 applicant upon receiving satisfactory evidence that the 7 applicant has successfully completed the professional standards 8 tour certification program offered by the university of Hawaii 9 or another program approved by the director. 10 §. -6 Licensure; fees. Upon the payment of a license 11 fee, the department shall issue a license valid for three years 12 to a person deemed to be qualified under this chapter. 13 § -7 Renewal of license; fees. Licenses shall be 14 renewable, upon the payment of a renewal fee, triennially not 15 earlier than ninety days before June 30. Failure to renew a 16 license shall result in a forfeiture of the license. Licenses 17 that have been forfeited may be restored within one year of the 18 expiration date upon payment of renewal and restoration fees. 19 Failure to restore a forfeited license within one year of the 20 date of its expiration shall result in the automatic termination

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1 of the license, and a person seeking restoration of a license 2 may be required to reapply for licensure as a new applicant. Ş 3 -8 Fees; establishment; disposition. (a) 4 Application, examination, reexamination, license, renewal, restoration, penalty, and any other fees relating to the 5 6 administration of this chapter shall not be refundable and shall 7 be established in rules adopted by the director pursuant to 8 chapter 91. 9 (b) Fees assessed shall defray costs incurred by the 10 department to support the operation of the tour guide licensing 11 program. Fees collected shall be managed in accordance with section 26-9(1). 12 13 § -9 Grounds for refusal to issue, renew, reinstate, or restore, and for revocation, suspension, denial, or condition 14 15 of, licenses. (a) In addition to any other acts or conditions 16 provided by law, the director may refuse to issue, renew, 17 reinstate, or restore, and may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the 18 19 following acts or conditions on the part of a licensee or license applicant: 20

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1	(1)	Failing to meet or maintain the conditions and
2		requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of
3		a license;
4	(2)	Engaging in false, fraudulent, or deceptive
5		advertising, or making untruthful or improbable
6		statements;
7	(3)	Being addicted to, dependent on, or a habitual user of
8		a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine, hallucinogen,
9		opium, cocaine, or other drug or derivative of a
10		similar nature;
11	(4)	Practicing the licensed profession while impaired by
12		alcohol, drugs, physical disability, or mental
13		instability;
14	(5)	Obtaining a license through fraud, misrepresentation,
15		or deceit;
16	(6)	Aiding and abetting an unlicensed person to directly
17		or indirectly perform activities that require a
18		license;
19	(7)	Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross
20		negligence, or manifest incapacity, in the practice of
21		the licensed profession;

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1	(8)	Engaging in conduct or practice contrary to recognized
2		standards of ethics for the licensed profession;
3	(9)	Violating any condition or limitation upon which a
4		conditional or temporary license was issued;
5	(10)	Engaging in business under a past or present license
6		issued pursuant to the licensing laws, in a manner
7		causing injury to one or more members of the public;
8	(11)	Failing to comply with, observe, or adhere to any law
9		in a manner such that the director deems the applicant
10		or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a
11		license;
12	(12)	Having had a license revoked or suspended, or having
13		been the subject of other disciplinary action, by
14		another state or a federal agency for any reason
15		provided by the relevant licensing laws or this
16		section;
17	(13)	Having been convicted of a crime, whether by nolo
18		contendere or otherwise, directly related to the
19		qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed
20		profession;

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1	(14)	Failing to report in writing to the director any
2		disciplinary decision issued against the licensee or
3		applicant in another jurisdiction within thirty days
4		of the disciplinary decision;
5	(15)	Employing, utilizing, or attempting to employ or
6		utilize, at any time, any person not licensed under
7		the licensing laws where licensure is required; or
8	(16)	Violating this chapter, chapter 436B, or any rule or
9		order of the director.
10	(b)	Any licensee or applicant who violates this section
11	may be fi	ned not more than \$1,000 per violation.
12	\$	-10 Constitutional rights. This chapter shall not be
