BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"§356D- Pet animals. (a) The authority shall allow		
5	any resident of a public housing project or state low-income		
6	housing project to keep one or more pet animals in the		
7	resident's unit, subject to applicable state laws, county		
8	ordinances, and any reasonable conditions.		
9	(b) The authority may charge a refundable pet deposit for		
10	each pet animal but shall not impose a monthly pet fee or pet		
11	rent.		
12	(c) For purposes of this section:		
13	"Pet animal" has the same meaning as defined in section		
14	<u>711-1100.</u>		
15	"Reasonable conditions" include:		
16	(1) Policies on nuisance behaviors;		
17	(2) Leash requirements;		



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1	(3)	Insurance coverage requirements;	
2	(4)	Policies on the maximum number of pet animals allowed,	
3		based on the unit's size; and	
4	(5)	Bans on specific dogs that a county law enforcement	
5		agency has deemed dangerous or vicious;	
6	provided	that reasonable conditions shall not include bans on	
7	<u>entire do</u>	g breeds or limitations on a pet animal's size.	
8	(d)	Nothing in this section shall prevent the authority	
9	from immediately acting to remove a vicious animal to protect		
10	persons or property."		
11	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
12	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
13	begun bef	ore its effective date.	
14	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

Description:

Requires the Hawaii Public Housing Authority to allow any resident of a public housing project or state low-income housing project to keep 1 or more pet animals in the resident's unit, subject to applicable state laws, county ordinances, and any reasonable conditions. Provides that the Authority may charge a refundable deposit for each pet animal but shall not impose a monthly pet fee or pet rent. Allows the Authority to remove a vicious animal to protect persons or property.
