
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 Judiciary Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2024.

3 SECTION 2. Act 70, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, is amended
4 as follows:

5 1. By amending part II to read:

6 **"PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

7 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
8 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
9 herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of
10 funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium
11 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The total
12 expenditures and the number of permanent and temporary positions
13 established in each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium shall not
14 exceed the sums and the position ceilings indicated for each
15 year, except as provided in this Act.

6 adjustments for [~~services on a fee basis costs~~] purchase of
7 service providers that account for [~~increase~~] increases in
8 inflation."

9 3. By adding a new section to read as follows:

10 "SECTION . Act 70, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, part
11 IV, section 8, Item A6, in the amount of \$600,000, or balances
12 thereof, unallotted, allotted, encumbered, or unrequired for a
13 new accounting system, is hereby lapsed."



1 4. By amending part IV to read:

2 "PART IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

3 SECTION 8. The sum of [~~\$20,955,000~~] \$39,955,000

4 appropriated or authorized in part II of this Act for capital
5 improvement projects shall be expended by the judiciary for the
6 projects listed below; provided that several related or similar
7 projects may be combined into a single project, if a combination
8 is advantageous or convenient for implementation; provided
9 further that the total cost of the projects thus combined shall
10 not exceed the total of the sums specified for the projects
11 separately. The amount after each cost element and the total
12 funding for each project listed in this part are in thousands of
13 dollars.

2 "PART V. ISSUANCE OF BONDS

3 SECTION 9. General obligation bonds may be issued, as
4 provided by law, to yield the amount that may be necessary to
5 finance projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV of
6 this Act; provided that the sum total of the general obligation
7 bonds so issued shall not exceed [~~\$17,955,000.~~] \$36,955,000."

8 SECTION 3. Act 38, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, part III,
9 as amended by section 3 of Act 5, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020,
10 is amended by amending section 7.1 to read as follows:

11 "SECTION 7.1. [~~(a) Beginning on the effective date of~~
12 ~~this Act the judiciary shall submit a weekly report to the~~
13 ~~legislature that includes the following information for all~~
14 ~~inmates released pursuant to supreme court orders entered in~~

18 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of

19 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and

20 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined

21 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the



1 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
2 to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons
3 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
4 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the
5 public interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.

6 SECTION 5. If any portion of this Act or its application
7 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
8 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
9 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
10 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
11 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
12 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
13 extent possible.

14 SECTION 6. If any manifest clerical, typographical, or
15 other mechanical error is found in this Act, the chief justice
16 may correct the error. All changes made pursuant to this
17 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next regular
18 session.

19 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

21 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
