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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE BOATING FACILITIES.

### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board 4 may lease fast lands and submerged lands within an existing 5 state boating facility by public auction, a request for proposals, or by direct negotiation pursuant to section 171-59 6 and chapter 190D, for private development, management, 7 8 maintenance, and operation [; provided that any lease of fast 9 lands or submerged lands pursuant to a request for proposals 10 shall be subject to section 200-2.6, regardless to which state 11 boating facility the fast or submerged lands are attached]. 12 As used in this section, [the term] "state boating 13 facility" means a state small boat harbor, launching ramp, 14 offshore mooring, pier, wharf, landing, or any other area under 15 the jurisdiction of the department pursuant to this chapter." SECTION 2. Section 200-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17

16	SECTION 3. (a) There is established a state boating	
17	facility lease pilot program within the department of land and	
18	natural resources to be implemented and managed by the division	
19	of boating and ocean recreation under which the board of land	
20	and natural resources shall lease one state small boat harbor in	
21	its entir	ety, including fast lands and submerged lands within

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it, for private development, management, maintenance, and
 operation; provided that the lease shall only be issued for a
 small boat harbor within a county with a population less than
 nine hundred thousand.

5 (b) The pilot program shall be exempt from the prior
6 legislative authorization required by section 171-60(a), Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes. The lease may be issued by public auction,
8 request for proposals, or direct negotiation.

(c) All employees of the division of boating and ocean 9 10 recreation of the department of land and natural resources who 11 occupy civil service positions and whose functions are replaced 12 as a result of this Act shall retain their civil service status, 13 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be reassigned 14 within the division of boating and ocean recreation without loss 15 of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable 16 collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior 17 service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously 18 earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges in accordance 19 with state personnel laws; provided that subsequent changes in 20 status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and 21 compensation laws.



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1 The department of land and natural resources shall (d) 2 submit a report of its findings and recommendations on the pilot 3 program, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature 4 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular 5 session until the termination of the pilot program. The report 6 shall include a recommendation on whether the pilot program 7 should be continued, modified, or terminated. 8 (e) The state boating facility lease pilot program shall 9 terminate on June 30, 2044. 10 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 12 begun before its effective date. 13 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000; 16 provided that this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2044, and sections 200-2.5(a) and 200-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall 17 18 be reenacted in the form in which they read on the day prior to 19 the effective date of this Act.
