A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	" <u>§6E-</u> Review; forty-five days. (a) Notwithstanding
5	any law to the contrary, the department shall approve or make a
6	determination within forty-five days on a completed and
7	submitted application for any:
8	(1) Proposed state project under section 6E-8; or
9	(2) Construction, alteration, disposition, or improvement
10	of any nature on privately owned historic property
11	under section 6E-10.
12	(b) If the department does not make a determination within
13	forty-five days, the application shall be deemed to be approved
14	and any necessary permits from the department shall be deemed to
15	be_granted.
16	(c) If the department rejects the application, the
17	department shall provide written notification to the applicant

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concerning the reasons for the rejection and how the applicant 1 may remedy any deficiencies." 2 SECTION 2. Section 6E-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 4 "(a) Before any construction, alteration, disposition or 5 6 improvement of any nature, by, for, or permitted by a private landowner may be commenced which will affect an historic 7 8 property on the Hawaii register of historic places, the 9 landowner shall notify the department of the construction, 10 alteration, disposition, or improvement of any nature and allow 11 the department opportunity for review of the effect of the 12 proposed construction, alteration, disposition, or improvement 13 of any nature on the historic property. The proposed 14 construction, alteration, disposition, or improvement of any 15 nature shall not be commenced, or in the event it has already begun, continue, until the department shall have given its 16 concurrence or [ninety] forty-five days have elapsed. Within 17 18 [ninety] forty-five days after notification, the department 19 shall: 20 Commence condemnation proceedings for the purchase of (1)

Deems the application to be approved if state historic preservation division does not make a determination within forty-five days. If the application is rejected, requires state historic preservation division to explain in writing.
