A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds there is a need to support the Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy to ensure the 2 quality of health care and improve access to care for the people 3 of the State. With further resources, the college can 4 proactively address issues of the State's current health care 5 6 crisis and leverage pharmacists to fill gaps in care related to 7 medication management. Pharmacists are the most accessible 8 health care providers and strongly embedded as a trusted 9 resource in many remote communities. The college could leverage pharmacists across the health care spectrum to recruit and 10 retain strong pharmacists to practice in the State, create a 11 12 plan for an innovative pharmacy practice model, and serve as the 13 resource for the pharmacy profession as the medical system shifts to a value and team-based care model where pharmacy will 14 play in integral role in patient outcomes. 15

16 The purpose of this Act is to establish a pharmacist17 workforce assessment fee to fund activities of the Daniel K.

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1	Inouye college of pharmacy to support pharmacist workforce
2	assessment and planning efforts.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part V, subpart C, to be
5	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
6	"§304A- Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy special
7	fund. (a) There is established the Daniel K. Inouye college of
8	pharmacy special fund, to be administered and expended by the
9	university of Hawaii.
10	(b) The following shall be deposited into the special
11	fund:
12	(1) Appropriations by the legislature;
13	(2) Pharmacist workforce assessment fees established
14	pursuant to section 461- ;
15	(3) Grants, donations, gifts, or other income received for
16	the purposes of the special fund; and
17	(4) Interest earned or accrued on moneys in the special
18	fund.
19	(c) Moneys in the special fund shall be used to support
20	the Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy's activities related to
21	pharmacist workforce assessment and planning within the State;

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1	provided	that the pharmacist workforce assessment fees
2	transferr	ed and deposited into the special fund pursuant to
3	section 4	61- shall be used to support pharmacist workforce
4	assessmen	t and planning efforts, including the recruitment and
5	retention	of pharmacists, for rural and medically underserved
6	areas of	the State. This shall include but not be limited to:
7	(1)	Maintaining accurate pharmacist workforce assessment
8		information and providing or updating personal and
9		professional information, that shall be maintained in
10		a secure database;
11	(2)	Providing loan repayment to pharmacists who commit to
12		working in medically underserved areas of the State as
13		part of the Hawaii state loan repayment program
14		administered by the Daniel K. Inouye college of
15		pharmacy; and
16	(3)	Providing scholarships to qualifying pharmacy students
17		to be determined by the Daniel K. Inouye college of
18		pharmacy.
19	(d)	The Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy may disclose
20	informati	on specific to any pharmacist only with the express
21	written c	onsent of that pharmacist."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§461- Workforce assessment fee. (a) There shall be
5	assessed upon every license and permit issued by the board a
6	pharmacist workforce assessment fee, as determined under
7	subsection (b), that shall be transferred and deposited into the
8	Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy special fund established
9	under section 304A
10	(b) The pharmacist workforce assessment fee shall be as
11	follows:
12	(1) \$, for each renewed license as a pharmacist;
13	(2) \$, for each new or renewed wholesale
14	prescription drug distributor license;
15	(3) \$, for each new or renewed pharmacy permit
16	under section 461-14; and
17	(4) \$, for each new or renewed permit under
18	section 461-15."
19	SECTION 4. Section 461-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:

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1 "(a) All licenses issued by the board, except temporary 2 licenses issued under section 461-7, shall be renewed biennially on or before December 31 of each odd-numbered year. Failure to 3 4 pay the biennial fee and [, beginning with the renewal for the 5 licensing biennium commencing on January 1, 2008,] workforce assessment fee and to satisfy the continuing education 6 7 requirement on or before December 31 of each odd-numbered year, shall constitute a forfeiture of the license as of the date of 8 9 expiration.

10 (b) Any license forfeited pursuant to subsection (a) may 11 be restored within three years upon payment of any penalty fee, 12 the current biennial fees, and the renewal fee and workforce 13 assessment fee for the next biennium, if applicable, upon 14 submission of proof of compliance with the continuing education 15 requirement for the prior biennium, and upon meeting any other requirements specified in rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91." 16 17 SECTION 5. Section 461-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 18

"(a) The board shall collect application, license, and
permit fees <u>and the workforce assessment fee</u> for each permit to
operate a pharmacy or for each license to operate as a wholesale

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1 prescription drug distributor and a fee for the issuance of a
2 permit in accordance with section 461-15(a)(1), (5), (6) and
3 (7)."

SECTION 6. The director of commerce and consumer affairs 4 5 shall disburse on a quarterly basis from the compliance 6 resolution fund, established pursuant to section 26-9(0), Hawaii 7 Revised Statutes, to the credit of the Daniel K. Inouye college 8 of pharmacy special fund established pursuant to section 9 304A- , Hawaii Revised Statutes, all moneys collected from the 10 pharmacist workforce assessment fee assessed pursuant to section 11 461- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.

SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the compliance resolution fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy special fund established pursuant to section 304A- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.

17 The sum shall be reimbursed from the Daniel K. Inouye
18 college of pharmacy special fund to the compliance resolution
19 fund by July 1, .

20 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the Daniel K.21 Inouye college of pharmacy special fund the sum of

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or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 1 \$ 2 year 2024-2025 for the purposes of the special fund as authorized under section 304A- (c), Hawaii Revised Statutes. 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of 4 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 5 6 SECTION 9.
