A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many of Hawaii's 2 farmers and ranchers are finding difficulty in securing the 3 financial support necessary to build a thriving, vibrant 4 business. Various sources of funding, including grants provided 5 by the United States Department of Agriculture and the State, counties, and private entities, are available for farmers and 6 7 ranchers. Access to grants from the United States Department of 8 Agriculture and other sources can increase production capacity, 9 provide new business opportunities, and increase employment 10 opportunities within the State's agricultural industry.

11 The legislature further finds that farmers and ranchers 12 applying for grants may have to complete an application process 13 that is sometimes complex. Without specific technical expertise 14 in grant writing, many farmers and ranchers may be deterred from 15 applying for those grants. Well-trained and skilled grant 16 specialists would be able to assist farmers and ranchers in 17 obtaining and fulfilling the requirements of grants.

The purpose of this Act is to establish grant specialist

6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 9 the establishment of two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) grant 10 specialist positions within the department of agriculture to 11 assist farmers and ranchers in applying for, obtaining, and 12 fulfilling the requirements of grants offered by the United 13 States Department of Agriculture, State, counties, or private 14 entities; provided that the grant specialist positions shall 15 prioritize assisting farmers and ranchers who produce local food 16 that is at least partly consumed within the State.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of18 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
20 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
21 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
