A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, by clarifying access to services, 2 3 adding a description of homeless youth, and expanding the ages 4 that may be served for the safe spaces for youth pilot program. 5 SECTION 2. Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is 6 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: 7 "SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the 8 department of human services [for administrative purposes only 9 a] office of youth services the safe spaces for youth pilot 10 program, which shall be an inter-agency initiative to provide 11 safe spaces in each county for youth experiencing 12 homelessness [-] or who are at risk of homelessness. 13 (b) [The program shall collaborate with all] All 14 departments of the State and its political subdivisions that offer services [for the purpose of ensuring] for the well-being 15 16 of youth in Hawaii, including the department of education, 17 department of health, department of human services, department

6	contracts with nonprofit organizations to provide [shelters]
