# H.B. NO. 2280

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STUDENT TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a shortage
 of school bus drivers in the State. This shortage has
 contributed to the suspension or cancelation of bus
 transportation services at ten high schools on Oahu and four
 schools on Kauai.

6 The legislature further finds that many school buses 7 transport few students, making standard size school buses unnecessary. Drivers of standard size school buses are required 8 9 to hold commercial driver's licenses, while those that drive 10 motor vehicles that do not fall within the definition of a commercial motor vehicle, like passenger vans carrying less than 11 12 sixteen people, do not. If the department of education and its 13 student transportation contractors prioritize the use of 14 vehicles that do not fall within the definition of a commercial motor vehicle, this may alleviate the shortage of drivers, and 15 16 ultimately the lack of student transportation services, because



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student transportation drivers will no longer need a commercial
 driver's license.

3 The purpose of this Act is to require school bus contracts 4 to include provisions that require contractors to prioritize the 5 use of motor vehicles that do not require those drivers to hold 6 a commercial driver's license.

7 SECTION 2. Section 302A-407, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is8 amended to read as follows:

9 "§302A-407 School bus contracts. (a) Any school bus 10 contract between the State and the contractor shall include a 11 provision requiring the contractor to equip the contractor's 12 vehicles with the signs and visual signals described in section 13 291C-95(d) and (g). The contract shall also include other 14 provisions as may be deemed necessary by the State for the safety of school bus passengers and shall include provisions 15 16 requiring compliance with the rules and standards described in section 286-181. 17

18 (b) In addition to the requirements of subsection (a), any
19 school bus contract between the State and the contractor shall
20 include provisions requiring the contractor to prioritize the



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1	use of vehicles that do not require drivers to hold a commercial
2	driver's license.
3	[ <del>(b)</del> ] <u>(c)</u> All moneys received from students and parents or
4	guardians of students by public schools for state-provided
5	school busing services, as authorized by section 302A-406, shall
6	be deposited into the school bus fare revolving fund. Except as
7	otherwise provided by the legislature, expenditures for the
8	operation of state-contracted school bus services, as authorized
9	by section 302A-406, shall be made from this fund."
10	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14	begun before its effective date.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
