RELATING TO PUPIL TRANSPORTATION SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) A person operating the following category or
4 combination of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as
5 provided in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of
6 drivers:

7 (1) Mopeds;

8 (2) Motorcycles, except for autocycles as described in
9 paragraph (2) of the definition of "motorcycle" in
10 section 286-2, and motor scooters;

Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating, 11 (3) 12 buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer 13 occupants, trucks and vans having a gross vehicle 14 weight rating of eighteen thousand pounds or less, and 15 autocycles as described in paragraph (2) of the 16 definition of "motorcycle" in section 286-2; and 17 (4)All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and any 18 vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle.

Amends sections 286-102 and 286-181, HRS, to allow the exemptions to include use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans for the school bus services, which may not meet school bus regulations but which shall otherwise meet vehicle requirements and qualifications set forth in chapter 19-143, Hawaii Administrative Rules, to the extent required by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Education, with the Department of Education providing Department of Education adult staff chaperone escorts of students while students are being transported between designated locations off-campus and designated locations on-campus.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Transportation

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUPIL TRANSPORTATION SAFETY.

PURPOSE: To permit the use of motorcoach, small buses, and vans as exemptions to school vehicles, which may not meet school bus regulations but which shall otherwise meet vehicle requirements and qualifications set forth in chapter 19-143, Hawaii Administrative Rules, to the extent required by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Education, with the Department of Education providing Department of Education adult staff chaperone escorts of students while students are being transported between designated locations off-campus and designated locations oncampus.

MEANS: Amend sections 286-102(b) and 286-181(b)-(e) and (i), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION: This bill is necessary to provide pupil transportation. There is a shortage of school bus drivers able to provide services to the Department of Education and certain independent schools, which shortage has resulted in the Department of Education and certain independent schools reducing school bus services for qualified students needing transportation to and/or from school.

> School bus services are an instrumental component to supporting fulfillment of the State's compulsory education laws that require school attendance for children between the ages of five and eighteen years.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> This bill promotes a solution to the school bus driver shortage to allow individuals transporting students on a small bus, motorcoach, or van between

designated locations off-campus and designated locations on-campus, and to do so with a valid commercial driver's license issued with a "P" endorsement under section 286-239(b)(4), HRS. Currently, individuals operating school buses must have a commercial driver's license with an "S" endorsement, providing for the authorization of driving school buses.

The proposed bill will provide for needed and timely access to and/or from school for a certain portion of students in the State.

Impact on the department and other agencies: To allow individuals transporting students on a small bus, motorcoach, or van between designated locations off-campus and designated locations on-campus to do so with a valid commercial driver's license issued with a "P" endorsement under section 286-239(b)(4), HRS. Currently, individuals operating school buses must have a commercial driver's license with an "S" endorsement, providing for the authorization of driving school buses.
