HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THIRTY-SECOND LEGISLATURE, 2024 STATE OF HAWAII H.B. NO. 2610

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISASTER RELIEF.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on August 8, 2023, 2 wildfires devastated Lahaina and parts of upcountry Maui. 3 Assistance from Hawaii and the mainland rushed to support Maui 4 and has continued into recovery. In particular, the Federal 5 Emergency Management Agency provided response support and offers recovery assistance via several programs, including the hazard 6 7 mitigation grant program. This grant program funds projects 8 that assist communities to build back better and stronger as 9 well as reduce future damage from natural hazards statewide. 10 However, the grant program requires a match from non-federal 11 funds and the current estimate of hazard mitigation grant program funding under the Maui wildfire disaster (FEMA-DR-4742-12 13 HI) is in excess of \$150,000,000. In previous disasters, many 14 potential applicants have faced difficulty planning for and 15 identifying funds for the local match and will face similar 16 difficulty in this instance. This difficulty has been one of 17 the primary impediments to the complete and efficient use of

1 hazard mitigation grant program funding and warrants assistance 2 from the State. 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a disaster relief 4 match special fund and appropriate funds to provide the local 5 match requirements of the Maui wildfires hazard mitigation grant 6 program. SECTION 2. Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 and to read as follows: 10 "§127A- Disaster relief match special fund; 11 established. (a) There is established the disaster relief 12 match special fund into which shall be deposited appropriations 13 by the legislature to the special fund. 14 (b) The disaster relief match special fund shall be 15 administered and expended by the department of defense to 16 provide the local match requirements of the Federal Emergency 17 Management Agency's Maui wildfires hazard mitigation grant 18 program (FEMA-DR-4742-HI). 19 (c) The department of defense: 20 (1) Shall evaluate applications for funding from the 21 special fund;

1 the local match requirements of the Federal Emergency Management 2 Agency's Maui wildfires hazard mitigation grant program (FEMA-3 DR-4742-HI) for projects that implement mitigation measures to 4 prevent and minimize the impacts the natural hazards affecting 5 the State.

6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of7 defense for the purposes of this Act.

8 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 9 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 11 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 12 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 13 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 14 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 15 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 16 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total 17 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 18 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 19 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 20
