A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCESS TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that every year, there 2 are a number of students who attend the Leeward community college Waianae Moku education center who are ineligible for 3 4 federal financial aid because they are unable to access their 5 parents' tax information, which is necessary to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Under the requirements of 6 the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, students up to the 7 age of twenty-four need to report the information in their 8 parents' tax records in order to apply for federal financial 9 10 assistance.

11 The legislature further finds that many of these students 12 who are twenty-four years old or younger report that their 13 parents are incarcerated or homeless or that they have no 14 communication with their parents for various other reasons. As 15 a result, a significant number of these students are ineligible 16 for federal financial aid and are often forced to drop out of 17 college. These students can end up with an outstanding balance

1 on their student accounts, which prevents them from continuing 2 their education or causes them to take out loans, which often 3 wind up in the collections process. Furthermore, being in 4 arrears regarding tuition poses a barrier to these students' 5 eligibility for financial aid in the future. Increasing the 6 accessibility to education for students is a matter of statewide 7 concern.

8 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds 9 to Leeward community college Waianae Moku to support and assist 10 students who are twenty-four years old or younger and ineligible 11 to apply for federal financial assistance through the Free 12 Application for Federal Student Aid application because they are 13 unable to access their parents' tax information.

SECTION 2. (a) Leeward community college Waianae Moku
shall establish a program to support and assist students who are
twenty-four years old or younger and ineligible to apply for
federal financial assistance through the Free Application for
Federal Student Aid application because they are unable to
access their parents' tax information.
