A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LAND USE POTENTIAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State needs to
 become self-sufficient in growing its own food, as eighty-five
 to ninety per cent of the State's food is imported.

The legislature further finds that forty-two per cent of
the State's agricultural land is currently unfarmed and that the
government is the largest landowner in the State, owning over
1,600,000 acres out of the 4,100,000 acres of total land in the
State.

9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

10 (1) Require the department of agriculture to contract a
11 third-party entity to compile a report evaluating the
12 agricultural land use potential of each parcel of
13 state-owned lands greater than five acres, excluding
14 commercial, residential, and department of education
15 lands; and

16 (2) Appropriate funds for the report.

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SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall 1 identify and evaluate each parcel of state-owned lands, 2 excluding commercial, residential, and department of education 3 4 lands, but including lands set aside under the Hawaii Homes 5 Commission Act, 1920, as amended, to determine the agricultural potential of each parcel through the assessment of water 6 7 availability and other physical elements associated with each 8 parcel. 9 The department of agriculture shall contract a third-(b)

10 party entity to compile a report comprising each parcel of 11 state-owned lands of five acres or more, excluding commercial, 12 residential, and department of education lands. The report 13 shall evaluate each parcel for its agricultural potential for 14 various agricultural crops and livestock production and shall 15 include the following information for each parcel, as

16 applicable:

- 17 (1) Tax Map Key;
- 18 (2) Total acreage;
- 19 (3) Millions of gallons per day in nearest aquifer;
- 20 (4) Inches per year of rainfall;
- 21 (5) Elevation;

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1	(6)	Nautical direction;
2	(7)	Subtotal of acres in zones;
3	(8)	Subtotal of acres in divisions;
4	(9)	Percentage of total acres per island; and
5	(10)	Presence of any of the following features:
6		(A) Agricultural lands;
7		(B) Important agricultural lands;
8		(C) Unique lands;
9		(D) Waste lands;
10		(E) Steep lands;
11		(F) Pasture;
12		(G) Dense Forest;
13		(H) Wetlands; and
14		(I) Gulches.
15	(c)	The department of agriculture shall submit the report
16	of its fi	ndings and recommendations, including any proposed
17	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
18	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2025.
19	SECT	ION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
20	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,	
21	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the



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appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 1 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure 2 3 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 4 per cent. This current declaration takes \$ or into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal 5 6 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 7 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 8 ceiling are that: 9 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to (1)10 serve the public interest; and 11 The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs (2) 12 addressed by this Act. 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 15 the purposes of this Act. 16 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of agriculture for the purposes of this Act. 18 19 SECTION 5.
