### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDFIRE PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the devastation
- 2 wrought by the deadly wildfires on Maui on August 8, 2023,
- 3 illustrates the urgency to take action to reduce the risk of
- 4 wildfires to communities throughout Hawaii and the need to
- 5 increase capacity within organizations that are already working
- 6 on fire mitigation across the State.
- 7 The legislature further finds that the patchwork of county,
- 8 state, and private land parcels that dominate the wildland-urban
- 9 interface around nearly all of Hawaii's communities requires a
- 10 high degree of planning and coordination to implement fuels
- 11 mitigation at a scale that would be effective in reducing the
- 12 risk of wildfire.
- 13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within
- 14 the department of land and natural resources a fireshed
- 15 partnership program.

1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to title 12, subtitle 4, to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:

6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context indicates otherwise, "department" means the department
8	of land and natural resources.
9	<pre>\$ -2 Fireshed partnership program; established. (a)</pre>
10	There is established within the department a fireshed
11	partnership program, to be overseen by a fireshed partnership
12	program coordinator, who shall be exempt from chapter 76.
13	(b) The fireshed partnership program shall:
14	(1) Establish a network of fireshed partnerships
15	consisting of agreements among managers of private,
16	county, state, and federal lands within and adjacent
17	to communities under high fire risk to plan and
18	implement fire-risk reduction through fuels
19	management, resource mapping and sharing, and
20	educational exchange;

15	(2)	Develop cross-boundary partnerships and memoranda of
16		understanding among landowners and determine costs and
17		resource-sharing opportunities to plan long-term,
18		spatially-contiguous fuels-mitigation projects at
19		landscape scales; and
20	(3)	Expand and develop multi-use, multi-partner
21		demonstrations of fuels-management strategies, such as

    partnership program coordinator within the department of land

### H.B. NO. 2721.

1 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 2 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 4 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 5 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 6 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 7 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 8 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 9 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total 10 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 11 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 12 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 13 per cent. The reasons for exceeding the or 14 general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 15 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to (1)16 serve the public interest; and 17 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 18 addressed by this Act.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
