A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CREATIVE MEDIA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii film and 2 television industry has continued to grow over the past twenty 3 years due, in part, to various state incentives that allow the 4 State to effectively subsidize some production costs. These 5 public-private partnerships have not only increased the number 6 of feature films, television series, and commercial productions 7 filming in Hawaii, but have also directly increased the number 8 of media-related jobs and the amount of tax revenue to the 9 State. During 2020, film production in Hawaii generated a net 10 of \$104,900,000 in gross domestic product and many times that 11 figure in economic benefits from that spending.

12 The legislature further finds that film festivals working 13 with capitol modern, formerly known as the Hawaii state art 14 museum, and other institutions have helped to support Hawaii 15 filmmakers by promoting new and emerging talent in Hawaii, 16 helping to provide careers in creative media, increasing funding 17 sources for filmmaking, and supporting creative media

collaborations through educational programs. Film festivals in
 Hawaii attract tens of thousands of viewers and generate
 millions of dollars in additional spending and economic
 benefits.

5 The legislature additionally finds that there is currently 6 a Hawaii film and creative industries development special fund 7 within the department of business, economic development, and 8 tourism that has been ineffective at supporting Hawaii's 9 filmmakers by failing to award grants for film, media, and 10 creative industries intellectual property development projects.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to repeal the Hawaii film and creative industries development special fund and transfer funds to a newly established filmmakers special fund, to be used by the state foundation on culture and the arts to award grants for film, media, and creative industries intellectual property development projects that are created and produced in Hawaii by Hawaii resident filmmakers.

18 SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 19 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 20 read as follows:

6	remaining on balance in the Hawaii film and creative industries

10	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the filmmakers
11	special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the state foundation on
13	culture and the arts to award grants for film, media, and
14	creative industries intellectual property development projects
15	that are created and produced by Hawaii resident filmmakers in
16	Hawaii.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
18	foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
