#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 134-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: "(c) A person may carry unconcealed and use a lawfully 3 4 acquired pistol or revolver while actually engaged in hunting 5 game mammals, if that pistol or revolver and its suitable 6 ammunition are acceptable for hunting by rules adopted pursuant 7 to section 183D-3 and if that person is licensed pursuant to 8 part II of chapter 183D. The pistol or revolver may be 9 transported [in an enclosed container, as defined in] in a 10 manner provided by section 134-25 in the course of going to and 11 from the place of the hunt, notwithstanding section 134-26." 12 SECTION 2. #### Report Title:

Firearms; Place to Keep; Motor Vehicles

#### Description:

Requires any person carrying an unloaded firearm in a motor vehicle to locate the firearm so as not to be readily or directly accessible from the passenger compartment of the vehicle or, if the firearm is being carried in a motor vehicle that does not have a compartment separate from the passenger compartment, to keep the firearm in an enclosed container that is locked, other than the glove compartment or console, and not in plain view.
