A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§134-</u> Public carry of firearms in sensitive places and
5	upon private business establishment or charitable establishment
6	premises; prohibited. (a) Except as otherwise provided by
7	federal or state law, no person shall intentionally, knowingly,
8	or recklessly carry on their person a firearm, concealed or
9	unconcealed:
10	(1) In any sensitive place; or
11	(2) Upon the premises of any business establishment or
12	charitable establishment unless the business
13	establishment or charitable establishment, or an agent
14	thereof, has expressly consented thereto. Express
15	consent may include signage.
16	(b) This section shall not apply to:
17	(1) Persons exempted under section 134-11; or

1	(2)	Detectives, private detectives, investigators, and
2		guards authorized by the chief of police to carry a
3		firearm in the particular sensitive place, business
4		establishment, or charitable establishment while on
5		duty in that sensitive place, business establishment,
6		or charitable establishment.
7	<u>(C)</u>	Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a
8	misdemean	or. A law enforcement officer may arrest an alleged
9	violator	of any provision of this section or issue a citation in
10	lieu of a	rrest, as provided in section 803-6.
11	(d)	In any prosecution, it shall be an affirmative defense
12	that the	person was exempt pursuant to subsection (b). The
13	presence	of a person at any sensitive place, business
14	<u>establish</u>	ment, or charitable establishment in subsection (a)
15	shall be	prima facie evidence that the person knows it is a
16	sensitive	place, business establishment, or charitable
17	establish	ment.
18	<u>(e)</u>	This section shall be considered to be supplemental to
19	any adopt	ed county ordinance and shall not be construed to
20	supersede	or modify county ordinances or rules; provided that
21	the count	y ordinance is not less restrictive than this section.

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1	(f)	For the purposes of this section:
2	"Bus	iness" means any sole proprietorship, partnership,
3	joint ven	ture, business trust, limited liability company,
4	business	corporation, professional corporation, or other
5	business	entity formed for profit-making purposes.
6	"Bus	iness establishment" includes any of the following
7	establish	ments operated by a business:
8	(1)	Any hotel, except individual hotel rooms and when
9		actively traveling through a hotel to or from an
10		individual hotel room;
11	(2)	Any financial institution;
12	(3)	Any industrial, commercial, or wholesale
13		establishment;
14	(4)	Any utility;
15	(5)	Any retail establishment where goods or services are
16		sold, leased, or otherwise provided to the public or
17		another business; and
18	(6)	Any restaurant or bar.
19	<u>"Cha</u>	ritable establishment" means any organization
20	classifie	d under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of
21	<u>1986, as</u>	amended.

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1	"Downtown Honolulu" means that area of Oahu bounded by the
2	H-1 Lunalilo freeway, Ward avenue, the ocean, and Nuuanu stream.
3	"Sensitive place" means courtrooms; establishments that
4	allow consumption of alcohol on its premises; government
5	buildings; high-density spaces, such as Waikiki and Downtown
6	Honolulu; hospitals; schools; state and city parks; and voting
7	service centers, as defined under section 11-1.
8	"Waikiki" has the same meaning as in section 712-1207."
9	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
