### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that when domestic abuse 2 occurs in a household in which children reside, a parent may 3 seek a restraining order against the abusive parent or household 4 The legislature further finds that the parent seeking member. 5 the restraining order is undeniably motivated by a desire to protect their children's well-being and shield them from further 6 7 However, the legislature also finds that the current law harm. 8 requiring referral by the court to the department of human 9 services for intervention or investigation by the child welfare services branch is unnecessary. This is because judges already 10 11 have the authority to refer, at their discretion, a case where 12 investigation is warranted to ensure the family's safety and 13 provide services to support their safety and well-being. 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to repeal the requirements of section 586-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 15

16 SECTION 2. Section 586-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 repealed.

2	court responsibilities. In cases where there are allegations of
3	domestic abuse involving a family or household member who is a
4	minor or an incapacitated person as defined in
5	section 560:5-102, the employee or appropriate nonjudicial
6	agency designated by the family court to assist the petitioner
7	shall report the matter to the department of human services, as
8	required under chapters 350 and 587A, and shall further notify
9	the department of the granting of the temporary restraining
10	order and of the hearing date. The department of human services
11	shall provide the family court with a written report on the
12	disposition of the referral. The court shall file the report
13	and mail it to the petitioner and respondent at least two
14	working days before the hearing date, if possible. If
15	circumstances prevent the mailing of the report as required in
16	this section, the court shall provide copies of the report to
17	the petitioner and respondent at the hearing. The report shall
18	be noted in the order dismissing the petition or granting the
19	restraining order."]



SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
