BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§304A-</u> John A. Burns school of medicine; resident and
5	nonresident tuition fees; service commitment. (a)
6	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any student who pays
7	resident tuition fees at the John A. Burns school of medicine
8	shall work in the State for at least five years within the ten
9	years immediately following the student's graduation from the
10	John A. Burns school of medicine.
11	(b) If the student fails to meet the requirement of
12	subsection (a), the student shall repay to the University of
13	Hawaii the difference between the resident tuition fee and
14	nonresident tuition fee for each year or fraction thereof that
15	the student fails to meet the requirement.
16	(c) The board of regents shall adopt rules pursuant to
17	chapter 91 to implement this section."
