A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to data from the United States Centers for Disease Control and 2 3 Prevention, over fifteen percent of the United States' population, or forty-nine million individuals, suffered from 4 5 bacterial infections linked to foodborne illness. Additionally, over 128,000 individuals are hospitalized, and three thousand 6 7 individuals die annually due to known pathogens transmitted 8 through food in the United States. The legislature recognizes 9 that Hawaii's very young and very old are the most susceptible 10 and vulnerable to the harm caused by foodborne diseases. The 11 legislature further finds that the proper handling of food, in 12 compliance with the federal Food Safety Modernization Act, from 13 source to sale is the best way to protect Hawaii and its people. 14 The purpose of this Act is to protect the health of 15 Hawaii's consumers by establishing a task force to review the 16 State's food security and food safety procedures.

1 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a task force to review the State's food security and food safety practices and 2 3 recommend specific actions to ensure that Hawaii's food imports, 4 including meat, produce, and all dairy products, are sourced, transported, stored, and distributed to retailers, restaurants, 5 institutions, schools, or any other designated place of sale to 6 7 the public, in compliance with the federal Food Safety 8 Modernization Act, including strict adherence to proper 9 temperatures and handling at every control point from source to 10 designated place of sale.

11 (b) To ensure Hawaii's food security and food safety, the 12 task force shall develop specific recommendations to ensure that 13 all foods and brands imported into Hawaii do not mislead or 14 confuse the public through name, pictures, artwork, or 15 statements in packaging or by advertising that imply the 16 imported food's origin is from Hawaii or has the same freshness 17 or qualities as food that is locally grown or produced in the 18 State.

19 (c) To ensure a broad level of support and high level of
20 necessary expertise, the task force members shall consist of:
21 (1) The director of health;

4 administrative or clerical support to the task force, including
5 the preparation of the report required by subsection (e).

6 (g) The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2024.
7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
