A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GAS APPLIANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2021, Hawaii was 2 the first state to declare a climate emergency through the adoption of Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 44, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, 3 4 Regular Session of 2021. The legislature further finds that the 5 State enacted a statutory zero emissions clean economy target, 6 which endeavors "to sequester more atmospheric carbon and 7 greenhouse gases than emitted within the State as quickly as 8 practical, but no later than 2045". 9 One way to help the State achieve its zero emissions clean 10 economy target is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Installing appliances that use electricity instead of gas in new 11 12 construction would substantially reduce greenhouse gas emissions 13 and help the State achieve its zero emissions clean economy

14 target.

15 The legislature further finds that over the past three 16 years, the District of Columbia and various cities and counties 17 in California, Colorado, Maryland, New York, Oregon, and

Washington have prohibited the installation of gas burning
 appliances, such as water heaters, refrigerators, ranges,
 dishwashers, clothes dryers, air conditioners, decorative
 fireplaces, and other similar devices in new construction within
 their cities or counties.

In addition to emitting greenhouse gases, stoves, ovens,
and other indoor appliances may harm human health by leaking
hazardous air pollutants inside homes even when not in use,
including cancer-causing benzene, according to a recent
California study. Another recent study found that gas stove
pollution causes roughly 12.7 per cent of childhood asthma in
the United States, on par with second-hand smoke.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit,
beginning January 1, 2025, the installation of gas appliances in
new construction within the State.

16 SECTION 2. Section 196-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows:

18 "\$196-5 Gas appliances [with pilot light] prohibited;
19 exemptions. (a) [No new residential type] Beginning January 1,
20 2025, no gas appliance [that is equipped with a pilot light]
21 shall be [sold or] installed in any new construction of a

residential or commercial structure within the State [after June
 30, 1980. Gas appliances sold after June 30, 1980, shall be
 equipped with an intermittent ignition system or other ignition
 devices in lieu of gas pilot lights].

(b) Beginning ninety days after [May 30, 1978,] June 30,
2023, the chief energy officer of the Hawaii state energy office
or its successor entity shall notify, in writing, all [retail
sellers] installers of gas appliances doing business in the
State of the provisions of this section.

10 (c) The provisions of this section shall not apply [to any 11 hot water heaters with pilot lights or] to any gas appliance 12 [which] that can be conclusively demonstrated by the equipment 13 manufacturer, to the satisfaction of the chief energy officer of 14 the Hawaii state energy office or its successor entity, that the 15 gas [pilot device in the] appliance[:

16 (1) Has a substantial lower life cycle cost than an electric ignition or other alternate ignition system; 18 (2) Is more energy efficient than available alternatives; 19 or

20 (3) Is necessary to safeguard public health and
21 safety.
