A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the Reinventing SECTION 1. Education Act of 2004 (Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004) 2 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to schools according to the different costs of educating students 4 5 with varying needs. Despite the intended equitable distribution of funds, the legislature notes that the weighted student 6 7 formula has placed small, remote schools at a disadvantage. For example, in the case of Hana high and elementary school, the 8 budgetary shortfall has resulted in the loss of several well-9 10 qualified teachers and has threatened the school's ability to offer minimum course requirements for students to earn high 11 12 school diplomas. If Hana high school is unable to offer its students the requisite courses for graduation, those students 13 14 will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour drive to the 15 next closest public high school, King Kekaulike high school. The legislature further finds that despite the current 16 17 economic situation, remote schools should be funded to retain



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1	the minimal personnel and resources necessary to allow students		
2	to graduate. One way to address this is to allow these schools		
3	to receive supplemental funding based on their remote status.		
4	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to authorize		
5	supplemental categorical funding for remote schools.		
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended by adding a new section to part V, subpart B, to be		
8	appropriately designated and to read as follows:		
9	" <u>\$302A-</u> Remote schools categorical funding. (a)		
10	Subject to legislative appropriations, a remote school may		
11	receive supplemental categorical funding to support additional		
12	instructional and support staff.		
13	(b) Any supplemental categorical funding provided to a		
14	remote school pursuant to this section shall be in addition to		
15	the allocation determined under the weighted student formula		
16	that is made to the remote school.		
17	(c) For the purpose of this section, "remote school" means		
18	any public high school, as defined in section 302A-101, except		
19	charter schools governed by chapter 302D, that is:		
20	(1) Located at least a one-hour drive away from the next		
21	nearest public high school; or
